

CHAPTER LXV.

AN ACT

Authorising the administrators of Zachariah Connell, deceased, to sell his estate, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Margaret Connell and John B. Trevor, administrators of the estate of Zachariah Connell, late of Fayette county, deceased, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to obtain on loan the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars, for the purpose of purchasing for the use and on behalf of the said estate, from the members of the Connellsville bridge company, the stock which they respectively hold in the said bridge lately erected over the Youghiogene river at the town of Connellsville aforesaid.

Administrators authorised to obtain a loan of 2500 dollars.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the administrators aforesaid, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to sell and convey the real estate of the said Zachariah Connell, deceased, or such parts thereof as they may think necessary to discharge the debts and judgments against the said estate, and the loan which they are authorised to obtain as aforesaid, upon such terms and conditions as they and the guardians of the said minors may deem best calculated to promote the interest of said estate, first giving public notice in one or more newspapers published in said county, for the space of thirty days before such sale, and the said sale and conveyance by the administrators so made, shall have the same effect in law as if it had been made by the said Zachariah Connell in his life time: *Provided,* That before they enter on the duties required of them by this act, they shall give bond, with sureties, to the satisfaction of the orphan's court, for the faithful performance thereof.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That every person attempting to pass over the bridge erected across the Youghiogene river, at the town of Connellsville aforesaid, without previously paying the toll, or having passed over the same, shall neglect or refuse to pay the toll at the toll house, erected contiguous thereto, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence the sum of one dollar; and every person riding or driving over said bridge faster than a walk, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence, the sum of two dollars: *Provided,* Notice of these regulations be printed in large letters on a board and put up, together with the rates of toll, and continued in a conspicuous place at each end of the bridge: *And provided,* That nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent persons from passing over said

bridge, who are authorised by the law under which the bridge was first erected, to pass free of toll.

CHAPTER LXVI.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled “An act to enable the Governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road, beginning at the west end of the Lancaster, Elizabethtown and Middletown turnpike road, at or near Middletown; from thence to the line of William Maclay’s land, adjoining the upper boundary of the borough of Harrisburg, in Dauphin county.”

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the president, managers and company, incorporated by the act to which this is a supplement, may and they are hereby authorised, forthwith to increase or diminish the rates of toll made payable by their act of incorporation, in the like manner and under the like restrictions as are provided by the act, entitled “An act to enable the Governor of this commonwealth to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from Lancaster, through Elizabethtown to Middletown,” passed the fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and four, in proportion to the distance travelled on their road, and to receive and collect such tolls in the manner directed by their act of incorporation: *Provided,* That nothing herein contained, shall be of any force or effect, until the stockholders in a general meeting, shall have agreed to conform to such regulations as any future legislature may enact; wholly exempting from or diminishing the toll on wagons, whose wheels shall not be less than nine inches and roll not less than twelve inches in width, and filed in the office of the
