CHAPTER LXXX.

AN ACT

For the relief of John Marshall, a captain of the revolutionary war.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorised and required, to pay to John Marshall, of Washington county, a captain in the revolutionary war, or order, immediately after the passing of this act, one hundred and twenty dollars, and an annuity of one hundred and twenty dollars during life, payable half yearly, to commence from the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.

CHAPTER LXXXI.

AN ACT

To vest the right of this commonwealth to the estate of Patrick M'Gowan, late of Fayette county, in his brother in law, Prtrick Miller.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all the right, title and interest, which this commonwealth may have acquired by reason of any escheat or supposed escheat, for want of heirs or known kindred of Patrick M'Gowan, late of the county of Fayette, deceased, in and to the estate real and personal, whereof the said M'Gowan died, seized or possessed, shall be, and the same is hereby

vested in Patrick Miller, late of Huntingdon county, now of Butler county, his heirs and assigns forever: Provided, That nothing in this act shall prejudice the rights of individuals.
