CHAPTER LXXXIV.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act, to incorporate and endow the German College and Charity School, in the borough and county of Lancaster, in this state."

WHEREAS by an act, entitled "An act to incorporate and endow the German college and charity school, in the borough of Lancaster, in this state," by the name of "Franklin College." The said institution was endowed with ten thousand acres of land, to be surveyed and patented at the charge of the state. And it is represented by the trustees thereof, that by the return of the several surveys of the said lands, into the Surveyor General's office, there appears to be four hundred and fifty-five acres, and one hundred and thirty-six perches of land, more than the said quantity of ten thousand acres contained therein. And it is resonable that the said institution should receive a patent or patents for such surplus quantity, free from any purchase money or fees, in furtherance of the benevolent designs of the legislature, in making the said endowment.

Therefore,

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the Patents free same, That the Secretary of the Land Office, be, and he is of expense to hereby directed to issue patents, free of expense, to the trusissue.
