CHAPTER LXXXV.

AN ACT

Altering and amending the act, entitled "An act, to incorporate the towns of Waterford and New-Haven, in the county of Lancaster, into a Borough.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the annual election for officers of the corporation of the borough of Marietta, shall hereafter be held on the Friday immediately preceding the third Saturday in the month of March. Time of electing corporation officers.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the burgess hereafter elected in the said borough, agreeably to the original act, before he enters on the discharge of the duties of his office, shall take an oath or affirmation, before a justice of the peace, of the county of Lancaster, that he will support the constitution of the United States and of this state, and that he will perform the duties of his office with fidelity. And thereupon he shall administer similar oaths or affirmations to each member of the town council and to the high constable. And the certificates of such oaths and affirmations shall be recorded in the books of the corporation. And the burgess shall also have power and authority to administer oaths or affirmations whenever the same shall be necessary, on the investigation of any matter within the cognizance of the corporation. And to issue scire facias against the high constable, in the same manner and for the same causes as the justices of the peace of this commonwealth now are or hereafter may be by law authorised to issue such scire facias against constables of townships. Oath, &c. to be taken by the burgess, And other officers. And recorded. Burgess empowered to administer oaths. And issue a scire facias against the high constable.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the high constable shall give bond, with security to the town council, in such sum as a majority of them shall deem necessary, conditioned for the faithful performance of all and singular, the duties enjoined upon him by the original act aforesaid, or by the by-laws of the corporation. And the treasurer appointed agreeably to the said act, shall also give such security, for the faithful discharge of the duties of his office, as the majority of the town council shall deem necessary. And if the high constable, treasurer, town clerk, or any officer appointed by the corporation, in pursuance of the act or by-laws aforesaid, shall make default, or neglect to perform the duties enjoined upon him or them, on complaint thereof being made to the burgess, by the majority of the town council, the burgess is hereby authorised to remove all or any of them from office. And he and the town council shall appoint others in their room and stead, to supply the vacancy or vacancies; and after such appointment and acceptance thereof, by the person so appointed, take security in manner aforesaid.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the fifth section and the last proviso of the sixth section of the original act, and so much of the said act as is hereby altered or supplied, be, and the same is hereby repealed.
