CHAPTER XCIX.

AN ACT

For the relief of Dickinson College.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the*

same, That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised and required, to cancel the mortgage deposited in the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, by the corporation of Dickinson college, for securing the payment of monies granted by the commonwealth, in pursuance of an act of assembly, entitled "An act, for the relief of Dickinson college," passed the twenty-fourth March, one thousand eight hundred

and three; and that the trustees of the said college be, and they are hereby forever discharged from the payment of any debt or debts due from the said corporation, to the commonwealth; and that the said corporation shall have and hold, all and singular, the lands heretofore granted to them by any act or acts of assembly, to them and their assigns for ever, free and clear of any claims now existing on the part of the

commonwealth, and shall have power to sell or dispose of all or any part thereof, as they may think proper.

CHAPTER C.

A SUPPLEMENT

For an act, entitled "An act to erect the town of Berwick, in the counties of Columbia and Luzerne, into a borough."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That that part of the borough of Berwick, which lies in the county of Luzerne, be, and the same is hereby excluded from the said borough, and that the division line between the counties of Luzerne and Columbia, shall be the northern boundary line of said borough. Part of the borough excluded.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the act to which this is a supplement, as is hereby altered or supplied, be, and the same is hereby repealed. Repeal.
