To authorise the Governor to incorporate the President, Managers and Company of the Newville and Roxbury Turnpike Road.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the Commission- same, That William Ramsay, Andrew Hikes, James Wood-ers named burn, Robert Peebles, David Sterrett, James Rogers, of Cumberland county; Samuel Tate Swansy, James M'Curdy, William Alexander and William Maclay, of Roxbury, in the

And by the same name, the said subscribers shall have perpetual succession, and all the privileges and franchises incident to a corporation; and shall be capable of taking and holding their capital stock, and the increase and profits thereof; and of enlarging the same from time to time by new subscriptions, in such manner and form as they shall think proper, if such enlargements shall be found necessary to fulfil the intentions of this act; and of purchasing, taking and holding to them and their successors and assigns, in fee simple, or for any lesser estate, all such lands, tenements, hereditaments and estate, real and personal, as shall be necessary to them in the prosecution of their works; and of suing and being sued, and of doing all and every other matter and thing, which a corporation or body politic may lawfully do.
