For the relief of the heirs of Conrad Coderman, deceased, a soldier of the revolutionary war.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the treasurer of the commonwealth be, and he hereby is directed to pay to the children and heirs at law of Conrad Coderman alias Conrad Catterman, deceased, three hundred dollars in full for a tract of donation land, to which the said Conrad Coderman was entitled for services rendered in the revolutionary war.

CHAPTER CV.

AN ACT

Authorising the Governor to appoint commissioners to Iay out a state road from the borough of Marietta, in Lancaster county, to intersect the Middletown and Harrisburg Turnpike Road at or near the house of John Niessly in Dauphin county.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised to Commission- appoint three disinterested commissioners, one of whom shall ers to be appearant in the borough of Marietta, in Lancaster county, in a direction the governor towards Harrisburg, to intersect the Middletown and Harrisburg turapike road at or near the house of John Niessly road.

at no point exceed an angle of five degrees; and the said Duty of comcommissioners or a majority of them shall proceed to per-missioners. form the duties required of them by this act on or before the first Monday of June next, and shall cause a draft of said road to be deposited in the office of the Secretary of this Commonwealth, and shall also deposit a copy of said draft in the office of the clerk of quarter sessions of the respective counties through which said road may pass which shall be a record thereof, and from thenceforth the said road shall be to all intents and purposes a public highway, and shall be opened and repaired in all respects as other roads are opened and repaired which are laid out by order of the courts of quarter sessions of the counties aforesaid.

Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That each of the said commissioners before he enters Oath, &c. to on the duties of said appointment, shall take and subscribe be taken. before some justice of the peace an oath or affirmation faithfully and impartially to perform the duties required of him by this act, and shall receive two dollars for each day he or commission-they shall be necessarily employed in said work, together ers. with a reasonable allowance for chain carriers and one marker, and the accounts of said commissioners shall be adjusted Their acand settled by the county commissioners of Lancaster and counts how Dauphin, and paid out of the respective county treasuries on settled. warrants drawn by the county commissioners of the same in proportion to the distance the said road may pass through each county.
