CHAPTER CX.

AN ACT

To authorise the Governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from the bank of the Monongahela river opposite the end of Smithfield street in the city of Pittsburg, through Birmingham, Elizabethtown, Perryopolis, to Uniontown in Fayette county.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-

sentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That William Wilkins, George Stewart, Philip Gilland and George Sutton of Pittsburg; Thomas Duncan of Birmingham; James Brice and George A. Bayard of Elizabethtown; Joseph Barnetz of Perryopolis; John Witherow, John Lyon, Thomas Irwin and Henry W. Beason of Uniontown; be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to perform the several duties hereinafter mentioned: That is to say, They or a majority of them shall on or before the first day of June next procure three or more books, and enter therein as follows; "We whose names are hereunto subscribed do promise to pay to the president, managers and company of the Pittsburg and Uniontown Turnpike Road company, the sum of fifty dollars for each and every share of stock in the said company set opposite to our respective names, in such manner and proportions, and at such times as shall be determined by the said president and managers of the said company in pursuance of an act of the general as-
