

CHAPTER CXII.

AN ACT

Making appropriations to defray certain expenses of government therein mentioned.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the*

same, That for the payment of the expenses hereinafter mentioned, the following sums are hereby appropriated, viz. for clerk hire in the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, for one year, two thousand three hundred dollars; for clerk hire in the office of the Auditor General, nine hundred dollars, in addition to the permanent appropriations of one thousand dollars, and a further sum of thirty-eight dollars and eighty cents, to pay a debt for extra clerk hire for the last year; for clerk hire in the office of the State Treasurer, eight hundred dollars, in addition to the permanent appropriation of two thousand and sixty-six dollars and sixty-six cents, for clerk hire in the office of the Secretary of the Land Office, for one year, commencing on the first of April, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, the sum of three thousand seven hundred dollars; which, together with the permanent appropriation of sixteen hundred dollars, may be expended by said officer in the employment of as many clerks in his office as he may find necessary; for clerk hire in the office of the Surveyor General, for one year, commencing on the first of April aforesaid; the sum of two thousand two hundred dollars; which, together with the permanent appropriation of two thousand dollars for that office, may be expended by the Surveyor General, in the employment of as many clerks in his office, as he may find necessary; and the clerk hire aforesaid, shall be paid quarterly, in the usual manner; for contingent expenses, in the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, for one year, two thousand five hundred dollars; for contingent expenses in the office of the Secretary of the Land Office, for one year, one thousand dollars; for contingent expenses in the office of the Surveyor General, for one year, including the expenses of the board of property, six hundred dollars; for contingent expenses in the Auditor General's office, two hundred dollars, in addition to the standing appropriation of four hundred dollars; and the sums hereby appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer, out of any money in the treasury, previous to which, the officers holding the aforesaid offices, shall exhibit their accounts and vouchers

for said expenditure, to the accountant department, to be adjusted and settled.

CHAPTER CXIII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled “An act, authorising the Governor to incorporate the President and Managers of the Armstrong, Indiana and Cambria Turnpike Road Company.”

WHEREAS by an act passed the seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, the Governor of this commonwealth was authorised to incorporate a company for the purpose of making an artificial or turnpike road, to commence at or near the town of Ebensburg, in Cambria county; thence through the borough of Indiana, in Indiana county, to intersect the Allegheny river at the town of Kittanning; it is represented that it would be much to the advantage and convenience of the said company to be divided into two separate companies.

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor be authorised and required to incorporate a company for the purpose of making an artificial or turnpike road, from, at, or near the town of Ebensburg, in Cambria county, to the west line of the borough of Indiana, in the county of Indiana; to be known by the name and style of the “Indiana and Ebensburg Turnpike Road Company.” And that David Stewart and John Blair, of Huntingdon county; George Roberts, Philip Noon and David Todd, of Cambria county; John Deniston, Daniel Stanard, Thomas Sharp, Joseph Moorhead, John M. Stewart, James M. Kelly, John Douglass and Robert Nixon, of Indiana county, be, and they
