CHAPTER CXIII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled “An act, authorising the Governor to incorporate the President and Managers of the Armstrong, Indiana and Cambria Turnpike Road Company.”

WHEREAS by an act passed the seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, the Governor of this commonwealth was authorised to incorporate a company for the purpose of making an artificial or turnpike road, to commence at or near the town of Ebensburg, in Cambria county; thence through the borough of Indiana, in Indiana county, to intersect the Allegheny river at the town of Kittanning; it is represented that it would be much to the advantage and convenience of the said company to be divided into two separate companies.

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor be authorised and required to incorporate a company for the purpose of making an artificial or turnpike road, from, at, or near the town of Ebensburg, in Cambria county, to the west line of the borough of Indiana, in the county of Indiana; to be known by the name and style of the “Indiana and Ebensburg Turnpike Road Company.” And that David Stewart and John Blair, of Huntingdon county; George Roberts, Philip Noon and David Todd, of Cambria county; John Deniston, Daniel Stanard, Thomas Sharp, Joseph Moorhead, John M. Stewart, James M. Kelly, John Douglass and Robert Nixon, of Indiana county, be, and they

are hereby appointed commissioners, to do and perform the several duties prescribed by the act to which this is a supplement, relative to the affairs of said company.

Another company to be incorporated.

Name.

Commissioners appointed

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the Governor be authorised and required to incorporate a company for the purpose of making an artificial or turnpike road from the west line of the borough of Indiana, in Indiana county, to the Allegheny river, at the town of Kittanning, in Armstrong county, to be known by the name and style of "The Armstrong and Indiana Turnpike Road Company." And that Thomas Hamilton, David Reynolds, James Montieth, Philip Templeton, Robert Woodward and Michael Macklin, of Armstrong county; John Neglee, John Parker and Walter Lowrie, of Butler county; William Cummins, Thomas Lucas, John Taylor and Thomas Sutton, of Indiana county, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners, to do and perform the several duties prescribed by the act to which this is a supplement, relative to the affairs of the said company.

When the commissioners may proceed.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That when ten or more persons shall have subscribed five hundred shares or more of the stock of said companies, the said commissioners or a majority of them, shall proceed as directed by the third section of the act to which this is a supplement.

Mode of applying present subscriptions.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the subscriptions already made, to the commissioners appointed by the act to which this is a supplement, shall and may be lawful, and shall be applied in the manner following, viz. the subscriptions made at Kittanning, to said commissioners, shall be in part of the stock of the Armstrong and Indiana turnpike road company; and the subscriptions made at Indiana, to the commissioners aforesaid, shall be in part of the stock of the Indiana and Ebensburg turnpike road company.

Regulations of the said companies.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said companies shall be under and liable to all the penalties, restrictions and regulations of the act to which this is a supplement, excepting so much of said act as is altered and supplied by this supplement; and so much of the act to which this is a supplement as is hereby altered or supplied, be, and the same is hereby repealed.
