BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the Certain titles same, That the titles of Thomas Silverwood, of the town of Mifflinburg, and county of Union, (an alien) to two certain islands, the one containing ten acres and twenty-three perches, and called in the patent thereof "Cherry Island," and the other containing two acres, be the same more or less, and called in the patent thereof "Round Island," both which islands are situate in the river Susquehanna, opposite to lands surveyed to James Silverwood, of Augusta township, Northumberland county aforesaid, be, and the same are hereby confirmed to him, the said Thomas Silverwood, his heirs and assigns, in fee simple, so far as the same may be defective, on account of the said Thomas Silverwood being an alien; and any conveyance, assurance or devise, which he the said Thomas, his heirs or assigns may make of the premises shall be, to all intents and purposes, as good and sufficient, as if the said Thomas Silverwood had been a citizen of the United States, at the time he purchased the same.

Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That William Milne, an alien, be, and he is hereby au-William Mil-thorised and enabled to hold and convey a certain messuage ne enabled to or tenement, and tract or piece of land, containing about hold certain forty-nine acres and thirty-nine perches, and situated in now, or late Bedminster township, Bucks county, in like manner

and with the same effect, as if he had been a citizen of this commonwealth, at the time of the purchase thereof by him: *Provided*, That nothing in this act contained, shall be con-Provisostrued to impair the vested rights of any other individual or individuals.
