## CHAPTER CXXV.

## AN ACT

For the relief of sundry Soldiers, Widows and heirs of Soldiers.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the State Treasurer, be, and he is hereby authoriced to pay to each of the heirs or legal represention to the tatives of captain John Brady, late of Northumberland county, captain John deceased, their proportionable parts of seven hundred and Brady. fifty dollars, granted to them by the second section of the act, passed the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen: Provided, Each of the heirs, release to the commonwealth, their claim to a tract of donation land.

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority afore-said, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authori Gratuity and sed to pay to Michael Longenbach, of Northampton county, annuity to or order, forty dollars immediately after the passing of this Michael Lonact, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, to be paid genbach, half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.

SECT. S. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby required Gratuity and to pay to Elizabeth Broadhead, or order, widow of Luke annuity to E-Broadhead, late of Northampton county, who was a captain lizabeth in the revolutionary war, the sum of forty dollars immediate-Broadhead. ly after the passing of this act, and anannuity of forty dollars during life, to be paid half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.

Sect. 4. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authori-Gratuity and sed to pay to Henry Wollery, of Northampton county, or or annuity to der, forty dollars immediately after the passage of this act, Henry Woland an annuity of forty dollars during life, to be paid half lery yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.

SECT. 5. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby required Gratuity and to pay to Maria Kelchner, widow and relict of Matthias annuity to Kelchner, late of Berks county, or her order, forty dollars Maria Kelchimmediately after the passing of this act, and thirty dollars ner. during life, to be paid half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.

SECT. 6. And be it further enacted by the authority afore-Gratuity and said, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authoriannuity to Is. sed to pay to Isabella Campbell, widow and relict of colonel sabellaCamp-Thomas Campbell, late of York county, formerly a captain in the revolutionary war, or her order, sixty dollars immediately after the passing of this act, and an annuity of sixty dollars during life, to be paid half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.

SECT. 7. And be it further enacted by the authority afore-Gratuity and said, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authoriannuity to sed and required to pay to Charles Willoughby, of Beaver Charles Wil. county, or his order, the sum of forty dollars immediately afloughby. ter the passing of this act, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, to be paid half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.

Secr. 8. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby directed James Smith to pay to James Smith Pollock, or order, of Columbia county, the sum of eighty dollars immediately after the passage of this act.

SECT. 12. And be it further enacted by the authority afore-Compensasaid. That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorition to the heirs, &c. of sed to pay to the heirs or legal representatives of Joseph Joseph Dun-Dunlap, or order, the sum of three hundred dollars in lieu of a tract of donation land.

SECT. 13. And be it further enacted by the authority afore-Annuity to Jo-said, That the State Treasurer be, and he is required to pay madepayable to Joseph Wren, or order, the annuity granted by the act, to himself, entitled "An act, granting an annuity to Joseph Wren for

life," and so much of the said act as is hereby altered or supplied is hereby repealed.

## CHAPTER CXXVI.

## AN ACT

To vest a certain Burying Ground in the Board of Health, and to provide for registering the Births of Children, in the city of Philadelphia and its vicinity.

WHEREAS the religious society of friends of Philadelphia, having had possession, under an equitable title, of a lot of ground in the township of Blockley, in the county of Philadelphia, containing one hundred and twenty-six perches and an half, adjoining lands of Elizabeth Powel and the corporation of the city of Philadelphia, the legal title to which, if it existed, has been lost or mislaid. And whereas the said lot of ground was used by them as a place of interment, but for the want of a full right thereto, its enclosures have been forcibly broken through, and interments of the dead have been made therein in a reproachful manner. And whereas for the reasons mentioned, being unable to correct those abuses, the said religious society did by a formal act, under the direction of their monthly meeting, cede and relinquish to the board of health, all their right to the said lot of ground, on condition that the board of health shall procure from the legislature of the commonwealth, an act to invest them and their successors with the legal title and estate in the same; and when obtained to be limited to the use of a place of interment of the dead And whereas the board of health have by their memorial prayed to be invested with the legal title to the said lot of ground, on the condition mentioned.
