

CHAPTER CXXVIII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act, to provide for the Education of children at public expense, within the city and county of Philadelphia."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the directors of the public schools for the townships of the Northern Liberties and Penn, may determine to which schools the poor children of their respective townships may be sent, who are too distant from the public schools established to be there taught. And the expenses for instructing such poor children, shall be paid out of the county funds, in the same manner as is provided in the act to which this is a supplement, for educating poor children in the townships of Blockley and Kingsessing.

CHAPTER CXXIX.

AN ACT

Relative to Paupers.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That whenever any person is chargeable on any township, county or city, the overseers of the poor, or directors of the poor house, in any county, as the case may be, shall, and they respectively are hereby authorised to sue for, recover and collect, any money due, or property belonging to such person, to be applied in defraying the expenses of keeping

Debts and property of paupers may be collected by the overseers of the poor, &c.
