CHAPTER CXXXIII.

AN ACT

For transferring certain powers and duties from the State Treasurer to the Auditor General, and for other purposes.

Seut. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby required within thirty days after the passing of this act, to deliver to the Auditor General all the books, records, deeds and papers in his custody and possession relating to the loan office, fice to be de- established by the act of the twenty-sixth day of February livered by one thousand seven hundred and seventy-three, entitled the treasurer " An act for emitting the sum of one hundred and fifty thousand pounds in bills of credit on loan, and providing a fund for the payment of public debts," and by the act of the fourth day of April one thousand seven hundred and eighty-five, entitled "An act for erecting and opening a loan office for the sum of fifty thousand pounds."

Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the Auditor General be, and he is hereby invested with similar powers for the purposes of enforcing payment of the balances on sums due to the commonwealth under the said acts, as were possessed by the trustees of the said loan office and State Treasurer, or which are now possessed by the Auditor General in respect to enforcing payment and collecting other public monies under his direction, and the Auditor General is hereby required to take the necessary measures to compel payment of the said balances.
