CHAPTER CXXXIV.

AN ACT

To incorporate the town of Stoystown in the county of Somerset.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the town of Stoystown in the county of Somerset, Borough of shall be, and the same is hereby erected into a borough, which Stoystownershallbe called the borough of Stoystown, bounded and limited ected. as follows: Beginning at a black oak south of George Hartzel's tan-yard, and a corner of John Lehmer's land near a Limits. spring run, from thence through said Lehmer's land to a small locust tree near the Somerset road, thence to a black oak at a spring in said Lehmer's meadow, thence through said meadow in a direct line to where the said spring run crosses the Berlin road, such a distance until it strikes a straight line with the eastern line of the meeting-house lot, and to the east corner thereof, thence a straight line to the first bridge on the turnpike road east of Stoystown, thence up the run to the said John Lehmer's land north of Stoystown, thence with the said line to a corner of George Kimmel's and Lehmer's land, and on the west of the Connemaugh road, thence to the north corner of the old burying ground on the west of Stoystown, thence including the same and running across the turnpike road to the lower part of the hollow in Peter Kimmel's field, thence a straight line with said hollow to the first spring, and thence along said spring run to the beginning.

SECT. 2. Their duties, and who shall be subject to the same penalties for mal-practices as by the said law is imposed; and the said judges, inspectors and clerks, before they enter upon the duties of their respective offices, shall take an oath or affirmation, before any justice of the peace of said county, to perform the same with fidelity, and after the said election shall be closed, shall declare the person having the greatest number of votes to be duly elected; and in case any two or more candidates shall have an equal number of votes, the preference shall be determined by lot, to be drawn by the two judges in presence of the inspectors and clerks; whereupon duplicate certificates of said election shall be signed by the said judges, one of which shall be transmitted to each of the persons elected, and

the other filed among the records of the corporation; and it Duty of high shall be the duty of the constable for the preceding year, to give notice in writing to each of the persons so elected as aforesaid, and in case of the death, resignation, removal or refusal to accept of any of the said offices, or if it should at any time happen that no election should be holden on the day and in the manner aforesaid, the chief burgess shall issue his precept, directed to the high constable, to hold an election in manner as aforesaid, to supply such vacancy, giving at least eight days notice, by six advertisements set up in the most public places in said borough: Provided, That the citizens of the borough of Stoystown aforesaid, shall be entitled to vote at the first election although they have paid no borough

Name and style. Powers and privileges.

SECT. 3. And be it further enacted by the authority afore-Corporation. said, That from and after the first Tuesday in May next, the chief burgess and town council duly elected as aforesaid and their successors, shall be one body politic and corporate, by the name and style of "The Chief Burgess and Town Council of the borough of Stoystown," and shall have perpetual succession, and the said chief burgess and town council and their successors, shall be capable in law, to have, get, receive, hold and possess goods and chattels, lands and tenements, rents, liberties, jurisdictions, franchises and hereditaments, to them and their successors, in fee simple or otherwise, not exceeding the yearly value of five thousand dollars; and also to grant, sell, let and assign the same lands, tenements, hereditaments and rents, and by the name and style aforesaid, they shall be capable in law to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded in any of the courts of law of this commonwealth, in all manner of actions whatsoever, and to have and to use one common seal, and the same from time to time, at their will, to change and alter, until it be otherwise directed by law.

Penalty for gess, &c.

Sect. 4. And be it further enacted by the authority aforenotexecuting said, That if any person duly elected as chief burgess, member or discharg of the town council, or high constable as aforesaid, and having ing the duties received notice thereof as directed by this act, shall refuse or of chief bur, releast to take upon himself the execution of the said office. neglect to take upon himself the execution of the said office,

to which he shall have been elected, or having taken upon himself such duties, shall neglect to discharge the same according to law, every person so refusing or neglecting, shall for every such offence forfeit and pay the sum of twenty dollars; which fine and all other fines and forfeitures incurred, and made payable in pursuance of this act or any of the bylaws and ordinances of the town council, shall be for the use of the said corporation, and shall be recovered before any Howrecoverjustice of the peace, in the same manner that debts not ex-ed. ceeding one hundred dollars are by law recoverable, and when so recovered, shall be forthwith paid to the treasurer of the borough; and it shall be the duty of the officers of the And payable. said borough, on receiving anymoney belonging to the corporation, to pay the same to the treasurer forthwith: Provided, Proviso. That no person elected as aforesaid, shall be liable to a fine for refusing or neglecting to serve more than one in four vears.

Sect. 5. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the chief burgess and town council, and high con. Oath, &c. to stable, and each of them, before entering upon the duties of be taken. their respective offices, shall take and subscribe an oath or affirmation, before any justice of the peace of said county, to support the constitution of the United States and of this state, and to perform the duties of their respective offices with fidelity; and the certificates of such oaths and affirmations, shall be filed among the records of the said corporations.

Sect. 6. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall be the duty of the said town council, five Quorum. of whom shall be a quorum, to hold meetings on the third Tuesday in April, July, October and January, in each year, and oftener if occasion requires; at which meetings they may Powers and enact, revise, repeal and amend all such by laws, such rules, duties of the regulations and ordinances as shall be determined by a ma. town council. jority of them, necessary to promote the peace, good order, benefit and advantage of the said borough, particularly of providing for the regulation of the markets, improving, repairing and keeping in order the streets, lanes, alleys and highways, ascertaining the depth of vaults, sinks, pits for necessary houses, and making permanent rules relative to the foundations of buildings, party walls and fences; they shall have power to assess, apportion and appropriate such taxes as shall be determined by a majority of them, necessary for carrying the said rules and ordinances from time to time, into rying the said rules and ordinances from time to time, into complete effect; and also appoint a town clerk, treasurer, treasurer, suand two persons to act as street and road supervisors, a clerk pervisors, of the market and a collector annually, and such other officierk of the cers as may be deemed necessary from time to time, and the market, colsame officers from time to time to remove for misdemeanor lector, &c. to in office, which meetings of the said town council shall be be chosen. held at such convenient place as a majority of them shall think proper in said borough, until a town house is erected:

That in assessing such tax, due regard shall be had to the valuation of taxable property, taken for the purpose of raising county rates and levies, so that the said tax shall not in any year exceed one half cent in the dollar of such valuation, unless some object of general utility shall be thought necessary. in which case a majority of the taxable inhabitants of said borough shall approve of and certify the same in writing under their hands, to the town council, who shall proceed to and assess the same accordingly.

Sect. 7. And be it further enacted by the authority afore-Power and duty of chief said, That the chief burgess elected and qualified agreeably to this act, is hereby authorised to issue his precept as often as occasion may require, directed to the collector, commanding him to collect all taxes so assessed, and the same to pay over to the treasurer, and the said chief burgess is hereby authorised to carry into effect all by-laws and ordinances enacted by the town council, and whatsoever else shall be enjoined upon him or them, for the well ordering and governing said borough; and shall also have power to mitigate or remit fines and forfeitures, in all cases where it shall appear that the person or persons so fined, did not offend intentionally, or on their having some other just and reasonable excuse to plead in his or their behalf.

Sect. 8. And be it further enacted by the authority afore-Duty of the said, That it shall be the duty of the town clerk to attend town clerk. all meetings of the town council when assembled upon business of the corporation, and perform the duty of clerk thereto, and keep and preserve the common seal and records of the corporation, and be answerable for the same, and also for the faithful discharge of all the duties which may be enjoined upon him by virtue of this act or the acts of the corporation, whose attestation, with the seal of the corporation, shall be good evidence of the act or thing so certified.

Sect. 9. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the treasurer shall give sufficient security for the Duty of the faithful discharge of the duties of his office, and for the safe treasurer. delivery of all monies, books and accounts appertaining thereto, into the hands of his successors upon demand and for that purpose.

> Sect. 10. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the street supervisors, treasurer, high constable, clerk of the market and collector, as well as other officers.

Sect. 11. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the chief burgess and president of the council, Court of apshall constitute a court of appeal, and prior to the collection peal. of any borough tax, the collector shall inform each inhabitant of the amount of his tax and of the time and place of appeal: Provided nevertheless, That the said court of appeal shall Proviso. have no other power as such, than to determine the justness of the apportionment of said taxes, and to remedy any griev-

SECT. 13. Sect. 14. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid That if any person or persons shall think him, her or Appealtothe themselves aggrieved by any thing done in pursuance of this court of comact, except in what relates to the imposing and collecting mon pleas. the borough tax and appointments made by the town council, he, she or they may appeal to the next court of common pleas,

to be held for the said county, upon giving security according to law, to prosecute his, her or their appeal with effect, and the said court having taken such order therein as shall seem to them just and reasonable, the same shall be conclusive.
