

CHAPTER CXXXVII.

AN ACT

Authorising Abraham Wismer and John Michener, administrators of the estate of John Funk, to convey certain real estate.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the legislature, that John Funk of the township of Hilltown, in the county of Bucks, did in his life time enter into a contract with certain inhabitants of the townships of Hilltown, Bedminster, Plumstead and New Britain, in the said county, to convey to them in trust for the use of a school, a certain lot or piece of land containing one quarter of an acre, and situated on the south east corner of his plantation, adjoining the road leading from Newtown to Quakertown, in the township of Hilltown aforesaid, as soon as a school house should be erected thereon and the erection thereof paid for. That the said school house has been erected and the erection thereof paid for, but that before the same was finally completed and the title executed agreeably to the terms of the contract the said John Funk died intestate.

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Abraham Wismer and John Michener, administrators to the estate of John Funk, late of the township of Hilltown, in the county of Bucks, deceased, be, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to grant and convey to Jacob Landis, Henry Anglemoyer and Andrew Wilson, and to their heirs and assigns, in trust for the use of a school, a certain lot or piece of one quarter of an acre of the land, whereof he the said John Funk died seized, intestate, situate in the township aforesaid, and adjoining the road leading from Newtown to Quakertown.*
