#### CHAPTER CXXXVIII.

#### ANACT

To provide for the repair of Arms, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the sum of two thousand nine hundred fifty Armory and eight dollars and seventy one cents, be, and the same is here arsenal at by appropriated to pay the expenses incurred at the armory Philadelphia and arsenal in Philadelphia; and that the further sum of one thousand dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated to pay such necessary expenses therein as shall be incurred until the first of April eighteen hundred and twenty.

# CHAPTER CXXXIX.

### AN ACT

To provide for the election of Constables in the village of Elizabethtown, in the county of Lancaster, and in the borough of Wilkesbarre in the county of Luzerne.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the electors residing in the village of Elizabeth-Two persons town, including Wealandsburg, in the county of Lancaster, to be elected shall at the usual time appointed by law for the election of and returned constables yearly, and every year after the passage of this act, elect at the house of Michael Coble, in said village, two suitable persons, being citizens thereof, for the office of constable, and shall return the names of the persons so elected, to the next court of general quarter sessions of the peace, to One of whom be holden for said county, and the said court shall appoint one of them constable for said village, which constable when to be appoinso appointed shall have the same powers, and be subject to all the penalties and regulations which constables have and are subjected to under the laws which now or hereafter may exist within this commonwealth.
