CHAPTER CXLIX.

AN ACT

To authorise the settlement of the accounts of Daniel Bussier, late a paymaster of Pennsylvania Militia.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Accountant Officers of this commonwealth, be, and they are hereby authorised and required to adjust and settle the accounts of Daniel Bussier, late a paymaster of Pennsylvania militia, in the service of the United States, for monies expended by him under the act of the twenty-seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, on their receiving muster and pay rolls, * unthenticated in the usual forms and manner; and that the said officers be authorised to admit to the credit of the said Daniel Bussier, such sums of money as he shall by proper vouchers show have been paid to the commissioned officers or substitutes, for the use of a private or privates of the company or regiment to which such officer or substitute belonged.
