Appointing commissioners for exploring a route for opening a direct communication from the town of Millford, in the county of Pike, to the borough of Wilkesbarre, in the county of Luzerne.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-

sentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Isaac A. Chapman, of Luzerne county, Jason Commission- Torry, of Wayne county, and John Brodhead, of the county ersappointed of Pike, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to explore, survey, lay out and mark on the ground, a road be-Route of the ginning at the town of Millford, in the county of Pike, and from thence by the nearest and best route to the borough of Wilkesbarre, in the county of Luzerne; and the said com-Duty of com- missioners shall proceed to perform the said service on or before the first day of August next, and they shall deposit a copy of a draft of the said road in the office of the clerk of the court of quarter sessions, in each county through which the said road shall pass; and the said clerks respectively, shall

enter the same on the records, which shall be a record of the said road, and from thenceforth shall be to all intents and purposes a public highway, and shall be opened and kept in repair in the same manner as other roads laid out by the authority of the courts in the counties aforesaid: Provided, Proviso. That before the said commissioners enter upon the duties of their appointment, they shall each take and subscribe an oath Oath, &c. to or affirmation before some judge or justice of the peace, to be taken. perform the duties enjoined and required by this act, with fidelity and impartiality, a transcript thereof shall be filed with each draft of the road and deposited in the respective counties through which the said road shall pass.
