

CHAPTER II.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An act to organise the provisional county of Warren for judicial purposes.

Commissioners to collect all taxes due.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passing of this act, it shall be the duty of the commissioners of the county of Warren, to order the collection and payment of all county and road taxes due and assessed on seated property and unseated lands, and of all taxes due said county previous to its organization for judicial purposes, which may remain unpaid by the several collectors, and that the same be paid into the treasury of said county.

Collection of taxes on unseated lands.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said commissioners shall proceed to collect the said taxes on unseated lands, in the same manner as taxes on unseated lands are collected in other counties.

Account of monies.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the commissioners of Warren county shall keep an account of all monies paid into the treasury thereof by the collectors aforesaid, and shall exhibit the same in the settlement of their accounts with the county of Venango.

CHAPTER III.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act making appropriation and provision for carrying into effect the erection of a bridge over Bald Eagle creek, in the county of Lycoming," passed March nineteenth one thousand eight hundred and ten.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General*

Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That if any person or persons shall wilfully ride, drive or lead any horse or other creature out of a walk when crossing said bridge, over the Bald Eagle creek, on the line between Centre and Lycoming counties, he, she or they, shall on conviction thereof, before a justice of the peace in either of the said counties, forfeit and pay the sum of five dollars for every such offence, for the use of said bridge, to be recovered in like manner as debts of equal amount are by law recoverable. Penalty for driving out of a walk.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall be the duty of the supervisors of the adjoining townships, in Centre and Lycoming counties, on or before the first day of August next, to put up and keep in repair in some conspicuous place at each end of said bridge, a notice of the penalty described in the preceding section, for the information of travellers; and if the supervisors shall neglect or refuse to comply with the duties enjoined on them by this act, they shall forfeit and pay the sum of twenty dollars for every such offence, to be recovered and applied as is directed by this act: *Provided,* That nothing herein contained shall be construed to operate against any person, unless the provisions of this section shall have been complied with on the part of the supervisors of the said townships. Supervisors to give notice of this act. Provido.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That it shall be the duty of the justices of the peace before whom any fine or fines is, or are recovered, to pay over the same within one calendar month after the receipt thereof, to the treasurer of the county where the fine or fines is, or are recovered, and to be accounted for in the settlement of said treasurer's accounts, and to be drawn out of the treasury by the orders of the respective commissioners of each county for the use of the aforesaid bridge. Justices of the peace to pay over fines.
