

CHAPTER V.

AN ACT

Vesting in Jane Shaw a certain escheated estate therein mentioned.

SECT. 1. *BE* in enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all the right, title, interest, claim and demand of this Commonwealth, of, in and to the personal estate of William Wallace, in the hands of administrators, or in the hands of any other person or persons, with the interest due or accrued thereon, be, and the same is hereby released to Jane Shaw, her heirs and assigns: *Provided*, That nothing in this act contained, shall in anywise prejudice the rights of individuals, or impair any other claim to the said personal estate than that which this Commonwealth has, or might have by reason of the said escheat.

CHAPTER VI.

AN ACT

Authorising the guardians of the minor children of Henry Crouse, deceased, to sell part of his real estate.

SECT. 1. *BE* it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Rudolph Harley and Adam Fisher, guardians of the minor children of Henry Crouse, late of the township of West Nantmill, in the county of Chester, deceased, or the survivor of them be, and they or the survivor of them, are hereby authorised and empowered to sell at public vendue, at such time and upon such terms as shall appear to them, the survivor of them, most for the interest of the estate of said intestate, a certain undivided one fourth part of a forge land.

Guardians of the children of Henry Crouse authorised to sell an undivided one fourth part of a parcel of land.
