

CHAPTER XXV.

AN ACT

Authorising Michael Newman and Peter Winebrenner, trustees of the the German reformed congregation of the borough of Hanover, in the county of York, to sell and convey a certain lot of ground therein mentioned.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Michael Newman and Peter Winebrenner, trustees of the German reformed congregation of the borough of Hanover, in the county of York, or the survivor of them be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to sell a certain lot of ground in York street, in the borough aforesaid, known on the general plan of said borough by number eighty-three, in behalf and for the benefit of the said congregation, and to execute a deed of conveyance, in fee simple, to any purchaser for the same, and such deed of conveyance shall be held available in law to all intents and purposes.*

CHAPTER XXVI.

AN ACT

Authorising the election of additional constables in different townships of this Commonwealth.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That on the day appointed by law for the election of constables in the borough and township of Shippensburg, in Cumberland county, the electors of said borough and township shall in each year elect four suitable persons, being citizens of said borough and township, for the office of constables, and shall return the names of the persons so elected to the*

next court of quarter sessions of the peace to be holden for the county of Cumberland, two of whom shall be appointed constables for said borough and township, with such security and restrictions as the law in such cases requires.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passage of this act, the electors residing within the township of Allen, in the county of Cum-^{Two constables for Allen township.}berland, shall annually on the same day and at the same place where they meet to choose supervisors of the highways, elect four reputable citizens in said township for the office of constable, and return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of quarter sessions of said county: And the said court shall appoint two of them to be constables for the aforesaid township, conformably to law, any law, usage or custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the qualified electors of the township of Bulskin, in the county of Fayette, shall annually hereafter meet at the school-house in the borough of Connelsville, on the day appointed by law for the election of constables in the different townships in this Commonwealth, and elect four suitable persons, inhabitants of said township, and return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of quarter sessions of said county, two of whom shall be appointed constables of the township aforesaid in the same manner with like power and authority, and subject to the same regulations and penalties as are provided and contained in the several laws concerning constables in this Commonwealth; and it shall be the duty of the present constable to give legal notice and hold said election as directed by this section. ^{Two constables for Bulskin township.}

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the passing of this act the electors residing in the township of Upper Smithfield, in the county of Pike, shall annually on the same day and at the same place where they meet to choose supervisors of the highways, elect four reputable citizens in said township for the office of constable, and return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of quarter sessions of said county: And the said court shall appoint two of them to be constables for the aforesaid township conformably to law, any law, usage or custom to the contrary notwithstanding. ^{Two constables in Upper Smithfield.}

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid.* That the electors of the township of Bridgewater, in Susquehanna county, shall annually at the same time and place, when and where they meet to choose supervisors of the highways, elect four reputable citizens in said township for the office of constable and return the names of the persons so elected to the next court of quarter sessions of the said county: And the said court shall appoint two of them to be constables for the said township, under the usual regulations, restrictions and penalties now by law provided for the elec- ^{Two constables in Bridgewater.}

tion, appointment and qualification of constables in this Commonwealth.

CHAPTER XXVII.

AN ACT

Directing the recorder of deeds for the county of Westmoreland, to put a certain deed upon record.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the recorder of deeds for the county of Westmoreland, be, and he is hereby directed to admit and put upon record a certain deed of conveyance executed by William Elliott and Barbara his wife, for a tract of land in said county, to John Hindman, in fee simple, dated the twenty seventh day of July, one thousand seven hundred and ninety five, and acknowledged before John Johnston, a justice of the peace for the county of Allegheny, in the same manner as if the deed had been acknowledged in due form of law.
