Secr. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That within three months after the report of the jury hereinbefore directed shall have been made and confirmed by the court of quarter sessions, the damages so assessed and confirmed shall be paid out of the treasury of the county of Philadelphia, to the person or persons whose property may of the treasu- have been injured by the suspension of the opening of the streets aforesaid.

CHAPTER XXXVII.

AN ACT

To vacate part of a state road laid out in pursuance of an act, entitled "An act authorising the Governor to appoint commissioners to lay out a state road from the borough of Marietta, in Lancaster county, to intersect the Middletown and Harrisburgh turnpike road, at or near the house of John Nissly, in Dauphin county.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That so much of the road laid out by the commissioners appointed under the act passed the twenty-third of March, eighteen hundred and nineteen, entitled "An act authorising the Governor to appoint commissioners to lay out a state road from the borough of Marietta, in Lancaster county, to intersect the Middletown and Harrisburgh turnpike road, at or near the house of John Nissly, in Dauphin county, as lies within the county of Lancaster, be and the same is hereby vacated,

and that so much of said act as is hereby altered or supplied be and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER XXXVIII.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An act to incorporate an academy or public school in the town of Waterford, and for other purposes therein mentioned."

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for "the trustees of Trustees to the Waterford academy" to grant, bargain and sell in fee sell 500 acres simple, to the best advantage for the use of the Waterford of land. academy, a certain tract of five hundred acres of land, surveyed and laid off in the reserved tract adjoining the town of Waterford, in the county of Erie, in pursuance of an act of General Assembly, passed the eleventh of April, A. D. one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, entitled "An act to provide for the selling the several reserved tracts of land adjoining the towns of Erie, Franklin, Warren and Waterford, and for other purposes therein mentioned," and on the payment of the purchase money, or on securing the payment thereof, to execute a deed in fee to the purchaser or purchasers with the appurtenances thereunto belonging: Provided. That the said trustees of the Waterford academy shall not be permitted to sell the same for less than ten dollars per acre.

Secr. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said trustees are hereby authorised and directed to vest the proceeds of the sale of the said five hundred Proceeds to acres of land with the appurtenances, in some productive be vested for fund or funds, and the interest thereof to be forever applied the use of by the trustees of said academy, in aid of other revenues to academy. compensate a teacher or teachers in said academy: And that it shall be the duty of the trustees of the Waterford academy. annually under the penalty of forty dollars each, to be
