CHAPTER LVI.

AN ACT

In aid of the act for making the turnpike roads from Susquehanna to Waterford, and from Northumberland to Anderson's creek, passed the twenty-second day of February, one thousand eight hundred and twelve.

SECT. I. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall be lawful for the different companies—who are incorporated by the act to which this is a supplement and the supplements thereto, to erect the bridge over the west branch of the Susquehanna, directed to be built by the twenty eighth section thereof, at the mouth of Sugar Camp run, instead of the point where the Susquehanna and Place chang-Waterford turnpike terminates, and that the expense of erect—ed for the eing the said bridge shall be paid out of the funds at the same rection of a period of the building, and in the manner directed by the ninth section of the further supplement of the act of which this is in aid, passed the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen.

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That it shall be lawful for the president and managers of the Philipsburg and Susquehanna turnpike company to construct their road by the best and nearest route from Company authorised to the site of said bridge, at the mouth of Sugar thorised to Camp run aforesaid, and from thence on the west side of the change the river to the termination of the Susquehanna and Waterford route in part, turnpike aforesaid, instead of carrying it on the east side of the Susquehanna as directed by the act to which this is in

aid.

SECT. 3. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the provise in the eighth section, and the whole of the twenty-eighth section of the act to which this is in aid be, and the same is hereby repealed.
