CHAPTER LVIII.

AN ACT

Authorising the Governor to appoint commissioners to view the ground from the west end of the Harrisburg bridge to the river Juniata, at or near Millerstown.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Governor be and he hereby is authorised to appoint three disinterested commissioners, one of whom shall be a practical surveyor to view the ground from the west end of the Harrisburg bridge to the river Juniata, at or near Millerstown, in the county of Cumberland, for the purpose of ascertaining the practicability of laying out a state road between Commissionthe two given points, and the probable expense of making ers to view a said road and bridging the waters which the same may pass; route for a and the said commissioners shall proceed to perform the service road. aforesaid, at such time as the Governor shall direct, and make report thereof in writing into the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, to be laid before the next Legislature, which said report shall be accompanied with a draft of the several courses and distances, and in such places as the said commissioners shall think necessary of the angle of degrees, of ascent and descent, with a horizontal line.

SECT. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That each of the said commissioners shall receive two Compensadollars for every day they shall be necessarily employed in tion. the service aforesaid, as well for going to as for returning from the same, with a reasonable compensation for the persons employed as chain carriers, and other purposes, which accounts shall be settled by the Auditor General and paid out

of any unappropriated monies in the State Treasury.

SECT. 3. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said commissioners and chain carriers shall before entering on the duties of their appointments, take and subscribe an oath or affirmation before a judge or justice of Commission-the peace, to perform the duties enjoined by this act with ers to take fidelity and importality a transmint where first post. fidelity and impartiality, a transcript whereof shall be filed with their report.
