CHAPTER LX.

AN ACT

Allowing mileage to jurors, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passage of this act, each and every person who shall be summoned, and shall serve as a Jurors entiguror in any court of this Commonwealth, shall be entitled to tledtosix and the sum of six and a quarter cents for each mile he shall tra- a quarter vel, going to and returning from the same, to be paid out of centsmileage the county treasury in the usual manner.

Sect. 2. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That from and after the first day of June next, no pronot to be thonotary or clerk of any court in this Commonwealth, shall paid for cendemand of any witness any sum for a certificate that he has tificate to served as a witness, and if any prothonotary or clerk shall witness, transgress the provisions of this section, he shall be deemed

guilty of a misdemeanor in office.

CHAPTER LXI.

AN ACT

To authorise the corporation of the city of Philadelphia, to regulate the ascents and descents of Callowhill street, in the township of Penn, and county of Philadelphia.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the commissioners of Spring-Garden shall and may, after the passing of this act, survey and regulate with Regulation of respect to ascents and descents, Callowhill street, from the Callowhill east side of Broad street, to the Lancaster Schuylkill bridge, street.
