

## CHAPTER LXII.

*A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT*

To an act, entitled "An act, for laying out, making and keeping in repair the public roads and highways within this Commonwealth, and for laying out private roads."

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the several courts of quarter sessions of the peace in the respective counties within this Commonwealth, shall have authority upon application by petition to them made, to enquire of, and to vacate any part of a state road within their proper county, which shall be judged to be supplied and rendered useless by any substantial and permanent turnpike road, made and completed agreeably to the laws of this Commonwealth, and the said court shall proceed therein by views and reviews thereof in like manner; and the like orders, proceedings and judgment shall be thereupon had, as are authorised and as is usually practised in vacating any county public road or highway, according to the directions and provisions of the act to which this is a supplement: *Provided,* That no stockholder in any turnpike company within the county where the application is made, shall be a viewer or reviewer.

## CHAPTER LXIII.

*AN ACT*

Authorising the Governor to procure sixty thousand dollars on loan.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised to negotiate a loan in behalf of this Commonwealth, for a sum not exceeding sixty thousand dollars (to meet any deficit \$60,000 loan.
