constitution and laws of this Commonwealth, as shall be necessary for the well ordering the affairs of the said company: Provided always, That no person shall have more than ten Provisovotes at any election, or in determining any question arising at such meeting, whatever number of shares he may be entitled to, and that each person shall be entitled to one vote for every share by him held under that number.

Sect. 4. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall be lawful to, and for the said president and managers, their superintendants, surveyors, artists and chain-bearers, to enter in and upon all, and every the lands, Company tenements and inclosures, in, through and over which the said may enter intended turnpike road may be thought proper to pass, and upon lands. examine the ground most proper for the purpose, as well as the materials in the vicinity that may be necessary in making and constructing the said turnpike road, and to survey, lay down, ascertain, mark and fix such route or track for the Route. said road, as in the best of their skill and judgment will combine shortness of distance, with the most practicable ground from the direction board at the forks of the road, leading to Wilsonville and the narrows of Lackawaxen, in Wayne county, to intersect the Milford and Owego turnpike road, near Wilsonsville, in the county of Pike, and generally they shall have like powers, authorities and privileges necessary for carrying on and completing the said turnpike road, and Same powers be subject to all the duties, qualifications, restrictions, penal-with the Costies, fines and forfeitures, and be entitled to like tolls and hecton & G. profits in proportion to the distance, as are given and granted Bend turnto the president, managers and company of the Coshecton and pike comp'y. Great-Bend turnpike road.

## CHAPTER LXXXII.

## AN ACT

To authorise the commissioners of Franklin county to sell and convey so much of the ground lately purchased for the erection of a new jail, as remains unoccupied.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General

Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the commissioners of the county of Franklin be, and they hereby are authorised and empowered at such time. and in such manner as they may deem fit and proper, to sell, and by sufficient deed or deeds, to convey in fee so much of the ground in the borough of Chambersburg, purchased by them for the erection of a new jail thereon, as is unappropriated and unnecessary for the convenience of the said jail, and to return the monies arising therefrom to the treasurer for the use of the county of Franklin.

## CHAPTER LXXXIII.
