

CHAPTER CXV.

AN ACT

To regulate fences in the county of Fayette, and for other purposes, and to prohibit the holding of fairs in the borough of Somerset, in the county of Somerset.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the first day of July next, all damages occasioned by horses, horned cattle or swine trespassing through or within any enclosure within the county of Fayette, shall be determined by referees upon actual view, to be appointed, and such damages recovered agreeably to an act, entitled "A supplement to an act, entitled, an act to extend the powers of the justices of the peace of this state," passed the first day of March one thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, with the several supplements thereto.

Referees to determine damages.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all fences shall be deemed lawful which are four and half feet high, if in the judgment of such referees the fence or fences viewed by them, shall be such in other respects as are generally constructed and deemed a sufficient fence within their respective townships.

Lawful fence 4 1-2 feet high.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the first day of July next, so much of any of the laws of this commonwealth relating to fences and damages by horses, cattle or swine as are hereby altered or supplied, be, and the same are hereby repealed so far as they respect the county of Fayette: *Provided,* That the provisions of this act shall not be extended to the boroughs of Uniontown, Connellsville, Brownsville nor Bridgeport.

Repeal of former laws.

Proviso.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the supplement to an act, entitled "An act to erect Somerset town, in the county of Somerset into a borough," as authorises the holding of fairs in the said borough, be, and the same is hereby repealed and made void, and the holding of fairs in the said borough of Somerset is prohibited and declared to be a common nuisance.

Repeal of law establishing fairs in Somerset.
