

CHAPTER CXVIII.

AN ACT

Repealing so much of an act, as prevents fishing with seines and brush nets in the Conodoguinet creek, in Cumberland county, passed the twenty-seventh of March, eighteen hundred and nineteen.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the act passed March, eighteen hundred and nineteen, to prevent fishing with seines and brush nets in the Conodoguinet creek, be, and the same is hereby repealed, from the mouth of said creek to the mouth of Lethart's spring.

CHAPTER CXIX.

AN ACT

To aid the Erie Academy.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Legislature, that an institution has been established at the borough of Erie, in Erie county, and incorporated agreeably to law, for the instruction of youth, under the style of the "Erie Academy," and that an academy and public school has been commenced, in which the various branches of useful knowledge are now taught, under the superintendance of the trustees of said institution: And further, that the present funds of the corporation are inadequate to build a house for the accommodation of the institution, and as the Legislature is desirous to aid and encourage seminaries of learning throughout the Commonwealth:

Therefore,

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Secretary of the Land Office be, and he is hereby directed and required to ascertain the amount of balances due from the owners and possessors of lots in the borough of Erie, in Erie county, on out lots and reserved tracts of land in the Erie reservation, for which patents have not been granted. Balances due on lots in the borough of Erie to be ascertained.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That when the said amount is so ascertained by the Secretary of the Land Office aforesaid, that he be authorised and required to cause a list of said balances to be made out and transmitted to the trustees of Erie academy. To be sent to trustees of Erie Academy.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said trustees, on the receipt of the said list of balances so to be made out and transmitted as aforesaid, shall give public notice, by advertisement, in one or more newspapers, that they are authorised to receive the sum of two thousand dollars out of the balances so due as aforesaid.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said trustees be, and the same are hereby authorised to receive from any of the said owners or possessors of the aforesaid in-lots, out-lots and reserved tracts, who may be disposed to pay the same in manner herein directed; a sum of money which shall amount to two thousand dollars, which said sum, to be paid and received as is herein directed, is hereby granted to the trustees of the Erie academy, to and for the use of that institution and to be applied by the said trustees to the erection of a building for the accommodation of said school and academy. \$2000 granted to the Erie Academy.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That any person or persons so indebted to the Commonwealth as aforesaid, shall be allowed to pay the whole or any part of the respective balances against them, to the said trustees, until the said amount of two thousand dollars shall be by the said trustees so received; and on the receipt of any sum or sums of money so paid and received as aforesaid, the treasurer of the said board shall give duplicate receipts therefor to the person paying the same, specifying the lot or tract of land on account of which such payment is made, one of which said duplicates shall be by the person paying the same, transmitted to the Secretary of the Land Office, who is hereby authorised and required to place the amount thereof to the credit of the person paying the same; on which credits the said Secretary is directed to issue patents in the same man- Persons indebted to the Commonwealth may pay to the trustees.

CHAPTER CXX.

AN ACT

Appointing commissioners to run and mark the division line between the counties of Centre and Union.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Jacob Kreider, of Centre county, James Dale of Union county, and John Hanna, of the county of Lycoming, be appointed commissioners, who shall employ two practical surveyors, to run the division line between Union and Centre counties.*

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said commissioners shall meet in May next, with two surveyors appointed as aforesaid, and shall view, examine and run the line now in dispute between Union and Centre counties, in such manner as they may think just, equitable and proper, and mark, in a plain manner, the line agreed upon by them or a majority of them: And if either of the before named commissioners should neglect or refuse to perform the duties enjoined on them by this act. then, and in such case, the Governor be and he is hereby authorised to appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of said commissioners on some succeeding day by them appointed; and it shall be the duty of the said commissioners to make report of the courses and distances of the line, to the Court of Quarter Sessions of their respective counties, there to remain of record as the established line between said counties: And the expenses necessarily incurred in running and marking said line shall be paid equally, by warrants*
