CHAPTER CXX.

AN ACT

Appointing commissioners to run and mark the division line between the counties of Centre and Union.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Jacob Kreider, of Centre county, James Dale of Union county, and John Hanna, of the county of Lycoming, be appointed commissioners, who shall employ two practical surveyors, to run the division line between Union and Centre counties.*

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the said commissioners shall meet in May next, with two surveyors appointed as aforesaid, and shall view, examine and run the line now in dispute between Union and Centre counties, in such manner as they may think just, equitable and proper, and mark, in a plain manner, the line agreed upon by them or a majority of them: And if either of the before named commissioners should neglect or refuse to perform the duties enjoined on them by this act. then, and in such case, the Governor be and he is hereby authorised to appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of said commissioners on some succeeding day by them appointed; and it shall be the duty of the said commissioners to make report of the courses and distances of the line, to the Court of Quarter Sessions of their respective counties, there to remain of record as the established line between said counties: And the expenses necessarily incurred in running and marking said line shall be paid equally, by warrants*

CHAPTER CXXI.

AN ACT

Authorising sundry persons to sell and convey certain estates therein mentioned, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Joseph Trego and Joshua Weaver, executors of the last will and testament of William Trego, be, and they are hereby authorised to sell a certain lot of ground situate in Honeybrook township, Chester county, to the highest and best bidder, and convey the same by deed, in fee simple, to the purchaser, as fully and effectually as William Trego could have done in his lifetime; and the proceeds arising from the sale aforesaid, shall be applied by the said executors in the manner directed by the last will and testament of the said William Trego. Executors of Wm. Trego authorised to sell certain lot.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the trust estate vested in Samuel Evans, by a deed executed to him by Evan Rice Evans, who was administrator of the estate of Jane Evans, deceased, for a tract of land situate in the township of London-Britain, Chester county, containing two hundred and twenty-four acres and one hundred thirty perches, with the usual allowance, in trust for the use of Elizabeth E. Wilkin, then a minor, be, and the same is hereby declared to be executed to the cestui que trust of Elizabeth E. Wilkin, and that the title to the aforesaid tract of land as fully as the same was held in trust by Samuel Evans for the use of Elizabeth E. Wilkin, is hereby declared to be vested in the said Elizabeth E. Wilkin and her heirs. Trust of a certain estate vested in E. Wilkin.
