CHAPTER XII.

AN ACT

To chable Catharine Augusta Newbold and others, administrators of Thomas Newbold, deceased, to sell certain real estate of the intestate.

Sect. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Catharine Augusta Newbold, administratrix, Herman Le Roy, Caleb Newbold, Junior, and Herman Le Roy, Junior, administrators of Thomas Newbold, deceased, are hereby authorised and empowered to make and execute good and sufficient deed or deeds of conveyance in fee simple, for two tracts of land and every part thereof in Bradford county, number nine hundred and sixty-eight and nine hundred and sixty-nine, each containing one thousand and ninety-four acres and one quarter; and that the purchasers thereof on receiving such deed or deeds from the said administrators, shall hold the said tracts of land and every part thereof as fully and completely vested in them, as if the deed or deeds had been executed by the said Thomas Newbold in his life-time.

CHAPTER XIII.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That it shall be the duty of the controllers who now

Duties of the sioners shall from and after the first day of March annually, ascertain the per centum upon the amount of the county tax which will produce the sum required by the controllers, and shall as soon as may be give notice thereof to the county

surer.

Dutics of the treasurer, who shall open and keep a separate account for the county trea- controllers, and as the tax shall be paid to him by the collectors, pass to the credit of the controllers, the amount agreeably to the rate per centum fixed by the commissioners, which shall be subject to such orders as the controllers may draw on the county treasurer, who is hereby directed to pay the same accordingly; and it shall be the duty of the said treasurer to give and take receipts for money so received and paid by him, in the same manner as is provided by the act, entitled "An act to regulate the compensation of the commissioners, to alter the time for appointing the treasurer for the county of Philadelphia, and for other purposes;" and it shall further be the duty of the said treasurer to report to the said controllers the state of their account, whenever they may require him so to do: Provided always, That if at any time the said controllers shall deem it expedient to borrow any sum or sums of money, in anticipation of the sum to be

placed to their credit as aforesaid, they shall have power to

borrow the same from any person or persons, or any body or bodies corporate or politic, and to pledge the sum so to be placed to their credit for the payment thereof: Provided also, That any sum or sums of money so borrowed shall be by the said controllers placed in the hands of the county treasurer, who is hereby required to receive the same, and to pay the same on the orders of the controllers: And provided 3d Proviso. That if the amount of money that the controllers may report to the commissioners as necessary for the first school district, shall not be expended in the year for which it may have been appropriated, then the surplus shall be considered as forming a part of the estimate for the succeeding year.

SECT. 4. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That the select and common councils, the commissioners of the incorporated part of the Northern Liberties, the commissioners of the district of Southwark, the commissioners of the district of Spring Garden, and the court of quarter sessions, shall annually, immediately after the election or appointment of the respective boards of directors, transmit a rectors to be list of the names of the directors elected or appointed by published. them respectively to the said controllers, who shall cause the same to be published in all the daily newspapers printed and published in the city and county of Philadelphia, and shall give personal, written or printed notice to every citizen so Expense appointed; for the expenses of which services the said conhow paid. trollers shall be allowed in the settlement of their accounts.

SECT. 5. And be it further enacted by the authority afore Repeal. said, That so much of the act to which this is a supplement, or of any other act as is hereby altered or supplied, be, and

the same is hereby repealed.
