## CHAPTER XXVI.

## AN ACT

To authorise the Governor to contract with John Bioren for printing the sixth volume of the laws of this commonwealth.

SECT. 1. BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised and
