

CHAPTER XLVII.

AN ACT

Authorising the Governor to incorporate the Centre and Kishacoquillas Turnpike Road Company.

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That for the purpose of making a turnpike or artificial road from or near Bellefonte, in the county of Centre, to the north end of the Lewistown and Kishacoquillas turnpike road, at or near Browns' mills, in Mifflin county, Thomas Burnside, Joseph Miles, John Fury, James Potter, John Brisbin, William Thompson, Joseph Kyle, John Johnston, James Brisbin, William Brown, junior, William Brisbin, Abner Reed, William W. Potter, William Irwin, John McDowell and Robert U. Jacobs, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the duties hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, they shall procure a sufficient number of books and in each of them enter: "We whose names are hereunto subscribed, do promise to pay to the president and managers of the Centre and Kishacoquillas Turnpike road company, the sum of fifty dollars for every share by us subscribed for, in such manner and proportion, and at such times and places as shall be determined on by the said president and managers, in pursuance of an act, entitled "An act authorising the Governor to incorporate the Centre and Kishacoquillas Turnpike road company." Witness our hands the day Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and ;" and shall give notice in at least one of the public newspapers printed in Bellefonte and Lewistown, of the times when, and places where the books shall be opened to receive subscriptions of stock to the aforesaid company, at which respective times and places some one or more of the aforesaid commissioners shall attend, and receive subscriptions from all persons of lawful age who shall offer to subscribe in said books, which shall be kept open for the purpose aforesaid at least six hours in every juridical day for the space of six days, or until the books shall have subscribed therein fifteen hundred shares, and the said commissioners shall adjourn from day to day and from time to time, until the whole number of shares aforesaid shall be subscribed.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That when fifty persons or more shall have subscribed six hundred shares, the commissioners or a majority of them shall certify under their hands and seals the names of the subscribers and the number of shares subscribed to the Governor, whereupon it shall and may be the lawful for the Governor by letters patent under his hand and seal of the state,

200 shares being subscribed the same to be certified to the Governor or &c.

Style of the
Corporation.

to create and erect the subscribers into one body politic and corporate, in deed and in law by the name, style, and title of "The president, managers and company of the Centre and Kishacoquillas Turnpike Road company," and by the said name the said subscribers shall have perpetual succession, and all the privileges and franchises incident to a corporation, and shall be capable of taking and holding their said capital stock and the increase and profits thereof, and of enlarging the same from time to time by new subscriptions, in such manner and form as they shall think proper, if such enlargement shall be found necessary to fulfil the intent of this act, and of purchasing, taking and holding to them and their successors and assigns, and of selling, transferring and conveying in fee simple or for any less estate, all such lands, tenements and hereditaments, and estate real and personal, as shall be necessary to them in the prosecution of their work, and of suing and being sued, and of doing all and every other matter and thing which a corporation or body politic may lawfully do, and generally have all the powers, authorities and privileges, and be subject to all the duties, qualifications, restrictions, penalties, fines and forfeitures which are given and granted to, or imposed upon the president, managers and company, in the act passed the twenty-fourth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and six, entitled "An act authorising the Governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from the bank of the river Susquehanna opposite the borough of Harrisburg to Pittsburg."
