

Schuylkill, and be liable to the same rules and regulations as if they had been commenced therein; and the prothonotary of the court of common pleas of the county of Berks, on or before the first day of May next, shall transcribe the docket entries of the said actions of ejectment so depending as aforesaid, and deliver the same and the records, documents and papers appertaining thereto, to the prothonotary of the court of common pleas of the county of Schuylkill, for which service he shall receive twenty-five cents for each docket entry transcribed, to be paid and taxed as costs of suit in such actions.

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## CHAPTER CXXXIX.

### *A SUPPLEMENT*

To an act, entitled “An act to compel assignees to settle their accounts, and for other purposes.”

SECT. 1. *BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That all the provisions of the first, second, third and fourth sections of the act, entitled “An act to compel assignees to settle their accounts, and for other purposes,” passed the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, be, and the same are hereby extended to the assignee or assignees appointed under the act, entitled “An act for the relief of insolvent debtors residing in the city and county of Philadelphia and their creditors,” passed the thirteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twelve.*
