AN ACT

Authorising compensation to Frederick Reidenower for damages done by a certain state road.

SECTION. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That on the written application of Frederick Reidenower, of the township of Pike in the county of Berks, if the same shall be made within one year after the passage of this act, the judges of the court of Quarter Sessions of the said county are hereby authorised to appoint six disinterested men to view and adjudge the amount of the damages (if any) sustained by the said Frederick Reidenower in consequence of a state road leading from Orwigsburg, in Schuylkill county, to Stetler's tavern, in the county of Montgomery, passing through the county of Berks, having been laid out and carried through the land of the said Frederick Reidenower, situate in Earl township, in the county of Berks, and if the said viewers or any five of them after ten days notice thereof given to the commissioners of Berks county, shall view the said land and any four of them shall agree as to the amount of damages sustained, the said viewers so agreeing, shall make a report of their proceedings to the next court of Quarter Sessions of Berks county, and if the said court shall approve of the same, the commissioners of the said county shall draw their warrant on the treasurer of the same county, in favor of Frederick Reidenower, for the amount so awarded to him; but if the viewers shall neglect to perform the duties required of them, or if the said court shall disapprove of their report, they shall, as often as the case may require, appoint other viewers, who shall proceed therein in manner aforesaid; and it shall be the duty of the said viewers in assessing damages, to take into consideration

Court of Quarter Sessions to appoint viewers.

Their report to be approved

Oaths of view-
ers. the advantages derived by said Frederick Reidenower from said road passing through his lands; and before entering on the duties herein prescribed, they shall take and subscribe an oath or affirmation, before some justice of the peace, faithfully and impartially to perform the same, which oath or affirmation so taken and subscribed, shall accompany their proceedings, and be filed in the office of the clerk of the court of Quarter Sessions of Berks county.

AN ACT

To incorporate the town of Landisburg, in the county of Perry, into a borough, and to appoint trustees for the public school house therein,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That the town of Landisburg, in the county of Perry, and territory included within the following boundaries, (to wit:) beginning at a post at the north west corner of Henry Fetter's garden, thence south eighteen and one half degrees, east thirteen perches, north seventy and one half degrees, east two and three-tenth perches, south eighteen and one half degrees, east thirteen perches, north seventy and one half degrees, east six perches and five tenths, south seventeen degrees, east eighteen and five-tenth perches, north thirty-nine and three fourth degrees, east nineteen perches, north sixty-seven and one half degrees, east one hundred and one perches and five-tenths, north twenty-one degrees, west thirty-four perches, south eighty and one half degrees, west thirty-five perches, north twenty-one degrees, west nine and five-tenth perches, south seventy-nine and one half degrees, west twenty-three and three-tenth perches, north twenty-one and a half degrees, west twelve perches, south seventy degrees and five-tenths, west seventy-one and five
