AN ACT

For the relief of Mary Smith, widow of John Smith, late paymaster of the eighty-eighth regiment, Pennsylvania militia.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That immediately after the passage of this act, the state treasurer is hereby directed to pay to Mary Smith, of the county of Philadelphia, or her order, the sum of one hundred and twenty-dollars, and twenty-eight cents, the balance due her late husband, as paymaster of the eighty-eighth regiment, Pennsylvania militia, the \$120 28, appropriated.

AN ACT

To authorise the opening of Exchange alley in the city of Pittsburg, on certain conditions.

WHEREAS, certain individuals owning lots number one hundred and fourteen, one hundred and thirteen, and one hundred and twelve, in the city of Pittsburg, have opened for public use an alley fifteen feet wide, through the centre of said lots, from Cecil's alley, running eastwardly towards St. Clair street, and the benefit of said alley would be greatly increased by extending it through lot number one hundred and eleven, to St. Clair street: Therefore, Preamble.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the court of common pleas of Allegheny county, on petition, shall appoint fifteen or more disinterested freeholders, who shall meet, on at least five days notice, and if Court to appoint 15 view-ers.
