

Their duties. any twelve or more attend, they shall view the premises, and if any twelve of those attending, being first duly sworn or affirmed, to perform the duties imposed on them by this act with fidelity, shall decide that the said alley is necessary for public use, through from Cecil's alley to St. Clair street, they shall proceed to lay out the same, fifteen feet wide, and assess the damages done to any lot or lots, (taking into consideration the advantages accruing, as well as the injury done,) and shall apportion the damages separately upon the lots or parts of lots benefited, according to a fair estimate of the benefit conferred on each lot, and designating the person or persons to whom such damage is done and payable, and if a sufficient number do not meet to act, or if they cannot agree, the court may at any time appoint others. The said viewers shall make report to the said court, and if approved by the court said report shall be entered of record, and the said alley shall thenceforth be deemed and taken to be a lawful public alley.

Report, &c.

Opening of alley.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That as soon as the costs and the damages so assessed shall be paid unto the persons in whose favor the same shall be awarded, or into said court by any individual or individuals, the prothonotary shall so certify to the court, and the court shall order said alley to be opened.

Costs,

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the costs shall be regulated as the costs of similar proceedings, under the laws for laying out, making and repairing roads in this commonwealth.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act concerning strays."

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all the provisions of the act entitled, "An act concerning strays," passed on the thirteenth day of April

eighteen hundred and seven, and the supplement thereto, passed the fifth day of March, eighteen hundred and nineteen, be and the same are hereby extended to the county of Schuylkill.

AN ACT

Appointing trustees for the Providence preparative meeting, of the society of Friends.

WHEREAS, James Purviance and Elizabeth his wife, did Preamble. grant, by their deed, dated the sixth day of December, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-nine, fifteen acres, one quarter and allowance, of land, situated in the township of Washington, county of Fayette, and commonwealth of Pennsylvania, to John Coope, Ebenezer Walker and Jonathan Hewit, in trust for the members of the Providence preparative meeting of the society of Friends, for the use of a meeting house and grave yard, and it has been represented that the said John Coope, Ebenezer Walker and Jonathan Hewit, are deceased: Therefore,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Jesse Coldren and Joseph Negus be and Trustees named. they are hereby appointed trustees for the said Providence preparative meeting of the society of Friends, to have and to hold the said fifteen acres, one quarter and allowance, of land, for the use of a meeting house and grave yard, in trust for the said Providence preparative meeting of the society of Friends, according to the purposes of the original grantor.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* Provision for the appointment of successors to the trust. That in case of death, resignation or removal, of one or both of the aforesaid trustees, that the members of the said Providence preparative meeting of the society of Friends, trust.
