AN ACT

To legitimate John Milton Rutherford and William Rutherford, sons of John Rutherford, in the county of Dauphin.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, John Milton Rutherford, son of John Rutherford, of Upper Swatara township, Dauphin county, by Ann Maxwell; and William Rutherford, son of the said John Rutherford by Priscilla Barrett, now Priscilla Rutherford, wife of the said John, the said William having been born before marriage, shall have and enjoy all the rights and privileges of children born in lawful wedlock, and that they shall be able and capable in law to take, hold, inherit, pass and transmit all and every estate, real and personal, of what kind or nature soever the same may be, which by law they might inherit, pass or transmit, had they been born in lawful wedlock; *Provided,* That nothing in this act contained shall be construed to interfere with the right of this commonwealth under the act entitled "An act relative to collateral inheritances."

AN ACT

To confer on Jane Chamberlain the rights, privileges and benefits of a child born in lawful wedlock.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Jane Chamberlain, late Jane Stanley, of Hamiltonban township, in the county of Adams, now inter-

married with Joseph Chamberlain, of the same county, the illegitimate daughter of Rebecca Stanley, late of Franklin township, in said county, deceased, shall have and enjoy all the rights, privileges, benefits and advantages of a child born in lawful wedlock, and shall be capable in law to inherit and enjoy any estate whatsoever: *Provided*, That nothing in this act contained shall be construed to interfere with the claims of the commonwealth under an act entitled "An act relating to collateral inheritances," passed seventh day of April, eighteen hundred and twenty-six.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled An act to empower the board of health to purchase and hold certain real estate, and for other purposes.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That from and after the passage of this act it shall and may be lawful for the said board of health to purchase and hold, in fee simple, or for any lesser estate, or term of years, one or more lot or lots of ground, not exceeding three in number, and each lot not to contain more than ten acres in extent, for the purposes mentioned in the first section of the act to which this is a supplement.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That it shall and may be lawful for the said board of health to sell, let upon ground rent or lease, the whole or any part or portion of the lot or lots heretofore purchased and now held by them, under the first section of the act to which this is a supplement, as also the whole or any part or portion of any lot or lots which the said board may hereafter purchase, in pursuance of the provisions of this act, and upon such
