

sale, letting upon ground rent, or otherwise, to make good and sufficient deeds of conveyance and assurance in the law to the purchaser or purchasers, lessee or lessees thereof.

Purchases heretofore made by board.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That all and every purchase heretofore made by the said board of health, of a lot or lots of ground for the purposes aforesaid, shall be deemed and taken, and are hereby declared to be good and available in law, any thing in the act herein referred to, to the contrary notwithstanding.

Part of former act repealed.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the first section of the said act of Assembly entitled An act to empower the board of health to purchase and hold certain real estate, and for other purposes, as is hereby altered and supplied, be and the same is hereby repealed.

If office fees are inadequate how funds may be raised.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That if the fees paid into the office are inadequate to defray the expenses of carrying into complete effect the provisions of the different acts for establishing a health office, that the said board of health are hereby authorized, by and with the consent of the Mayor's court, of the city of Philadelphia, and the court of Quarter Sessions of the county of Philadelphia, to draw a warrant on the commissioners of the county of Philadelphia for the amount required, and it shall be the duty of the commissioners of the said county to pay over to the said board the amount of said warrant, and they are hereby authorized and required to raise the money in any mode or manner in which money for the ordinary purposes and expenses of said county may by law be raised or obtained.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled An act for securing the city of Philadelphia and the neighborhood thereof from damages by gunpowder.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act the super-

intendant or keeper of the magazine, or his successor in office, shall and may expose to public sale all gunpowder that now remains in said magazine unclaimed, and which may have been stored therein two years previous to the date of this enactment, and all gunpowder which may hereafter be stored therein after it remains unclaimed for the time or period aforesaid: *Provided*, That public notice of the time and place of said sale shall first have been given in at least three daily newspapers published in the city of Philadelphia, three times a week, for four succeeding weeks previous to said sale, accurately describing the marks and numbers on the parcels of powder as aforesaid, and to give a written notice to the owner or proprietor of such gunpowder if the said owner or proprietor shall be known.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid*, That the proceeds of said sale, after deducting all costs and charges on the part of the superintendent or keeper shall be paid by said superintendent or keeper to the owner or owners thereof: *Provided*, he or they, the said applicants shall make it appear to the satisfaction of the superintendent or keeper that he or they are actual owner or owners thereof, within three months after the sale as aforesaid, otherwise the said superintendent or keeper shall pay the said proceeds, deducting as aforesaid, into the treasury of the state, for the use of the commonwealth.
