A SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled "An act to incorporate an academy or public school in the town of Warren, and for other purposes therein mentioned," passed the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the sum of two thousand dollars be and the same is hereby granted out of any unappropriated money in the treasury of this commonwealth, to be paid to the treasurer of the institution by the State Treasurer, on the order of the trustees of said academy, for the time being, or a majority of them, or of their successors, to be applied under their direction, one thousand dollars thereof in the erection of a building or buildings suitable for the accommodation of the institution, on such lot as may be or has been purchased for that purpose, and the purchasing of books, mathematical instruments, and the necessary philosophical apparatus, and the remaining thousand dollars shall be placed in some safe and productive fund or funds, and the income thereof shall be forever applied in aid of other resources to compensate a teacher or teachers in said academy: *Provided,* That the said trustees of the Warren academy give bond to the Governor to the amount of three thousand dollars, for the use of the commonwealth, conditioned for the faithful application of the money herein appropriated, to the purposes in this act mentioned, according to the true intent and meaning thereof.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That there shall be admitted into said academy, in consequence of the aforesaid appropriation, any number of poor children of said county that may at any time be offered, in order to be provided with books and stationary, and taught gratis: *Provided,* The number so admitted and taught, shall at no time be greater than five, and that none of the said children so admitted shall continue in said academy to be taught gratis, should others apply, longer than two years: *And be it further provided,* That before any part of the appropriation shall be paid on the order or orders of the trustees as aforesaid, they or a majority of them, shall duly certify that subscriptions to the amount of three hundred dollars have been obtained, and secured

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled "An act to increase the county rates and levies for the use of the Commonwealth," passed the twenty-fifth day of March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act it shall be the duty of the commissioners of each county to make out and file with the treasurer of the county a statement showing the adjusted valuation of the real and personal property, persons, trades and occupations, made taxable by the laws of the Commonwealth, with the statement of the sum assessed for the use of the Commonwealth, and the apportionment of the same, the rate per cent upon the adjusted valuation of property in each county, for county purposes, and that a similar statement shall be also made out and certified under seal by the commissioners of the county, and transmitted to the Auditor General on or before the first day of September in each and every year, and by him to be laid before the Legislature at the commencement of their session, any thing in the second section of the act to which this is a supplement to the contrary notwithstanding.
