## AN ACT

Relative to the courts in Westmoreland county.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Sheriff of the county of Westmoreland be and he is hereby authorized and required to adjourn the several courts of said county from the third Monday of February, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty-two, till the third Monday of April next, and all process, &c. returnable at February term of said year, shall thereby be continued as fully and effectually as if all the judges of the said several courts had been present and adjourned the same till the day last aforesaid.

Sheriff to adjourn courts from February to April.

## AN ACT

Granting aid to Jefferson college.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to the trustees of Jefferson college, in the county of Washington, two thousand dollars a year for four years, to commence on the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.

\$2,000 per annum for four years

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the trustees of Jefferson college shall cause annually to be instructed gratis, six students, in indigent circumstances,

To educate a certain number of students,

ces, if that number applies, for the term of four years, and annually thereafter twenty-four students, who shall be inhabitants or sons of citizens of this state, in the elementary branches of an English education, in a manner best calculated to qualify them for teachers in the English language: *Provided*, That the trustees of Jefferson college shall signify their assent in writing to the conditions of this act, directed to the State Treasurer on or before the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.

AN ACT

Authorizing compensation for damages done by certain state roads.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That on the written application of any of the citizens of Chester, Montgomery, or Bucks counties, if the same shall be made within one year after the passing of this act, the judges of the court of Quarter Sessions of the said counties, are hereby authorized and required to appoint a jury of the same number and under the same directions as is provided by the existing law for laying out and making and keeping in repair the public roads and highways in this commonwealth, and for other purposes, to view and adjudge the amount of damages sustained, if any, which shall be paid out of the funds of the proper county, in consequence of a state road lately laid out and opened through their land in said county, from New Hope in Bucks county, through Montgomery and Chester counties to the Maryland line, in a direction to Baltimore.
