AN ACT

Authorizing compensation for damages done by certain state roads.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That on the written application of any of the citizens of Chester, Montgomery, or Bucks counties, if the same shall be made within one year after the passing of this act, the judges of the court of Quarter Sessions of the said counties, are hereby authorized and required to appoint a jury of the same number and under the same directions as is provided by the existing law for laying out and making and keeping in repair the public roads and highways in this commonwealth, and for other purposes, to view and adjudge the amount of damages sustained, if any, which shall be paid out of the funds of the proper county, in consequence of a state road lately laid out and opened through their land in said county, from New Hope in Bucks county, through Montgomery and Chester counties to the Maryland line, in a direction to Baltimore.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That upon written application of any of the citizens of Bucks county, if the same shall be made within one year after the passing of this act, the judges of the court of Quarter Sessions of the said county are hereby authorized and required to appoint a jury of the same number and under the same directions as is provided by the existing law for laying out, making and keeping in repair the public roads and highways in this commonwealth, and for other purposes, to view and adjudge the amount of damages sustained, if any, to be paid as mentioned in the first section of this act, in consequence of a state road lately laid out and opened through their land in said county from Easton, in Northampton county, to Willow Grove, in Montgomery county.

AN ACT

For the relief of Ulrich Heckman and Adam Sunday, soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Ulrich Heckman, of Northampton county, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.
