

said institution may direct, not exceeding in amount three thousand five hundred dollars.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the name, style and title of the said president, directors and company for erecting a permanent bridge over the river Susquehanna, at or near Harrisburg, shall hereafter be "the Harrisburg bridge company," and by the said name shall have all the rights, privileges and franchises, and shall be capable of suing and being sued, and of doing all and every other thing as fully and effectually as under the act to which this act is a supplement, passed the third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and nine, they might or could do, as if the said name, style or title, had not been altered: *Provided,* That nothing herein contained shall in any way affect any of the proceedings of the said company heretofore had, but the same shall remain as valid to all intents and purposes as if this law had not been passed.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the time for commencing operations on the York Haven and Harrisburg bridge turnpike road, be and the same is hereby extended for the term of one year, and the time of completing the same, three years, from the passage of this act.

SECT. 11. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to David Donley, of Washington county, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to his order, the sum of forty dollars immediately, as a gratuity, and full compensation for his revolutionary services. gratuity to D. AN ACT

To alter the time of holding courts in certain counties, and providing for making indexes to certain records in Montgomery county.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the first Monday in August next, the courts of Common Pleas, Quarter Sessions, Oyer and
