

SECT. 9. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Magdalena Christine, of Berks county, the widow of a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to her order, the sum of forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly during life, to commence the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two. Same to M. Christine.

SECT. 10. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Samuel Wiley, of Fayette county, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to his order, the sum of forty dollars, immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two. Same to S. Wiley.

SECT. 11. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to David Donley, of Washington county, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to his order, the sum of forty dollars immediately, as a gratuity, and full compensation for his revolutionary services. gratuity to D. Donley.

AN ACT

To alter the time of holding courts in certain counties, and providing for making indexes to certain records in Montgomery county.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the first Monday in August next, the courts of Common Pleas, Quarter Sessions, Oyer and

Time of holding courts, in Mifflin county, changed.

Terminer, and general jail delivery, and Orphans court, in and for the county of Mifflin, shall be holden, and commence on the first Mondays of January, April, August and November of each year, and continue one week, subject to the provisions of the act entitled "An act to alter the judiciary system of this commonwealth, passed the twenty-fourth day of February, eighteen hundred and six, and not on the third Mondays of said months, as heretofore.

Certain courts in Huntingdon county to continue two weeks.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the second Monday of August, (the same being the time of commencement of the next August term,) the courts of Common Pleas and Orphans court, to be held in and for the county of Huntingdon, shall be continued two weeks, subject to the provisions of the said act, entitled "An act to alter the judiciary system of this commonwealth."

Judges in Huntingdon co. to fix on certain day for commencement of trial of civil issues at succeeding term.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the judges of the court of Common Pleas in and for the county of Huntingdon, or a majority of them shall be and they are hereby authorized and directed, at any term of said court, preceding any term which is to continue two weeks, to make an order, (to be entered of record,) that the trial of civil issues depending in said court shall commence during the next term, at a certain day, (when in their opinion the trial of criminal cases will be ended,) in either the first or second week of said term, to be fixed in said order, and at the next term the trial of such issues shall commence at the day so appointed, or as soon thereafter as in the opinion of the judges the other business of the court will permit, and the petit jurors summoned for the trial of criminal cases, shall also be jurors in all civil cases, in case the trial of the same shall be fixed to commence as aforesaid, during the first week of said term.

When petit jurors in criminal cases may serve.

17th judicial district. Fourth sect. of act of 1st April, 1831, repealed.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That from and after the tenth day of March next, the fourth section of the act passed on the first day of April, eighteen hundred and thirty-one, entitled "An act to establish a seventeenth judicial district, and for other purposes," shall be and the same is hereby declared to be thenceforth repealed, and the courts in the sixth judicial district shall be thereafter holden at the same time at which they were holden prior to the passage of the said act, except that in the county of Warren, the term shall commence on the first Monday in June, instead of the Monday following the fourth Monday in April: *And provided,* That the provisions of this act shall not extend to the county of Erie, except so much as requires the court of Oyer and Terminer to be held four times a year: *And provided also,* That the provisions of this section shall not invalidate any writ, process, recognizance, rule, or or-

ter, now issued or to be issued, taken or to be taken, in either of the courts aforesaid, but the same shall be return- able to and be in full force at the several and respective terms provided for by this section. This section not to invali- date process.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the term of the court of Common Pleas, Quarter Sessions, Oyer and Terminer and general jail delivery, and Orphans court, in the county of Allegheny, now commencing on the fourth Monday of June, shall hereafter commence on the third Monday of June. Time of hold- ing courts in Allegheny changed.

SECT. 6. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the commissioners of the county of Montgomery be and they are hereby authorized to direct the clerk of the Orphans court of the said county, as soon as convenient, after the passage of this act, to purchase a book or books, and make or cause to be made therein, a correct index to all the proceedings had in the said court, since the organi- zation of the said court in said county of Montgomery, contained in the several Orphans court dockets in the said clerk's office; in which index the name and names of intes- tates and others interested shall be first stated and arranged in alphabetical order. Commission- ers to direct making of in- dex to pro- ceedings of Orphans court of Montgome- ry county.

SECT. 7. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the expense of purchasing such book or books for such index, and the expense of making such index, shall be paid for out of the funds of the said county, on war- rants to be drawn on the county treasurer, by the commis- sioners of the said county. And it shall hereafter be the duty of the said clerk to keep up, at his own proper cost and charges, the index provided for in the foregoing section of this act, and deliver the same over to his successor in office, in the same manner which he is required to deliver over the other records of his office. Expense to be borne by county. Index to be continued by clerk.
