service no justice of the peace shall be entitled to fees or reward, and that the board of directors shall have authority to grant such other relief as they may judge right, and to discharge from the said house of employment of the county of York, every pauper whom they shall deem to possess sufficient mental and bodily ability to take care of him or herself, and to provide for his or her maintenance and support, but such pauper so discharged may at any time hereafter be re-admitted in the manner aforesaid, and any pauper whose legal settlement shall not be in the county of York, may be admitted into the house of employment by the board of directors, whenever they shall deem it expedient, upon such terms and be so discharged therefrom in such manner as shall be provided by their ordinances, rules and regulations; that so much of the act to which this is a supplement as is hereby altered, be and the same is hereby repealed.

AN ACT

Vesting the right of this commonwealth to the escheated estate of Joseph Dicks, deceased, in James Dicks and others.

In Delaware county.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the title which this commonwealth may have acquired by reason of an escheat, for want of heirs, of Joseph Dicks, deceased, of Delaware county, in and to the real and personal property whereof the said Joseph Dicks died seized and possessed, is hereby vested in James Dicks, William Dicks, Mary Ann Dicks, Sarah Jane Dicks, Peter

R. Dicks and Benjamin Dicks, of said county: *Provided*, Proviso.
That said estate shall be subject to the payment of the same tax to the commonwealth as if the same had descended to collateral relatives, under the provisions of the law of April seventh, eighteen hundred and twenty-six. Collateral inheritance tax.

AN ACT

To repeal part of the twenty-ninth section of the act entitled "An act for the recovery of debts and demands not exceeding one hundred dollars," passed the twentieth March, eighteen hundred and ten, so far as respects Bullskin township, in the county of Fayette.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of the twenty-ninth section of the act to which this is a supplement, passed the twentieth of March, eighteen hundred and ten, as prevents a person from serving as constable more than three years in any term of six years, be and the same is hereby repealed so far as respects the township of Bullskin, in the county of Fayette.
