A SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act to enable the Hebrew congregation known by the name and style of Kaal Kadosh Mickvo Israel, of the city of Philadelphia, to lease on ground rent a lot of ground in the city of Philadelphia, belonging to said congregation, and the relief of the Loganian Library," passed the fourteenth day of April, eighteen hundred and twenty-eight.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, it hath been represented to the legislature by the trustees of the above named congregation that in pursuance of the provisions of the above recited act of Assembly, they have sold and conveyed, in fee simple, the lot of ground therein mentioned, in four different parts, reserving separate ground rents, redeemable after twenty and before twenty-five years from the date of the deeds, yet doubt having arisen whether the said law can be so construed as to enable the said trustees to release and extinguish the said ground rents, reserved agreeably to the resolution of the said congregation, and the condition in the ground rent deeds contained: for remedy whereof,

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Samuel Hays, Simon Gratz, Zalegman Phillips and Abraham Myers Cohen, trustees of the Hebrew congregation of the city of Philadelphia, incorporated and known by the name, style and title of "Kaal Kadosh Mickve Israel," or a majority of them, trustees for the time being, be and they are hereby authorized to sign and execute full and sufficient releases and discharges of certain rent charges reserved by the trustees above named for the use of said congregation, on a grant and conveyance of a certain large lot of ground on the north side of Spruce street, between Ninth street and Acorn alley, in the city of Philadelphia, in four different parts, containing together, by actual measurement, ninety-nine feet six and an half inches on Spruce street, and one hundred and twenty-nine feet on Ninth street and Acorn alley, one of them to William Abbott, John Wilson Moore, Nathan Shoemaker and Thomas Zell, another to John Wilson Moore, another to Nathan Shoemaker, and the other to Henry M. Zollikoffier, agreeably to the terms and conditions of the deeds of conveyance from the said trustees to the said grantees, bearing date the*

thirteenth day of September, eighteen hundred and thirty-one, and upon their so doing the said grantees, their heirs and assigns, shall hold their respective lots free, clear and discharged from the rents thereon charged by the said deeds of conveyance, forever.

AN ACT

For the relief of James Ewing, James Seals, and Thomas Abbott, soldiers of the revolution; and Mary Lacky, a widow of a revolutionary soldier.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to James Ewing, of Huntingdon county, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or his order, forty dollars, immediately, as a gratuity for his services as a revolutionary soldier. \$40 gratuity to J. Ewing.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required, to pay to Mary Lacky, of Berks county, a widow of a revolutionary soldier, or her order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly, during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two. \$40 gratuity and annuity to M. Lacky.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required, to pay to James Seals, of Greene county, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to his order, forty dollars, immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars, payable half yearly during life, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two. Same to J. Seals.
