

appoint other viewers, who shall proceed therein in manner aforesaid, and it shall be the duty of the said viewers, in assessing damages, to take into consideration the advantages derived by said Philip Bauscher and Susanna Kemp from said road passing through their lands; and before entering on the duties herein prescribed, they shall take and subscribe an oath or affirmation before some justice of the peace, faithfully and impartially to perform the same, which oath or affirmation, so taken and subscribed, shall accompany their proceedings and be filed in the office of the clerk of the court of Quarter Sessions of Berks county.

Westmoreland county. Certain authority to a court rel. to a review of part of a road from Robbstown to New Alexandria.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That John Bierer of Westmoreland county, may present his petition to the court of Quarter Sessions of said county, for the review of so much of the road laid out under the authority of the act entitled An act authorizing the laying out a graded road from Robbstown, by way of General Markle's mill, Greensburg, and to intersect the northern turnpike road at New Alexandria, in Westmoreland county, passed second day of April, eighteen hundred and thirty-one, as passes through the land of said John Bierer, and the said court are hereby authorized, empowered and required to take such order on said petition, and the same proceedings shall be had, as if the said petition had been presented at the time required and prescribed by the existing laws of this commonwealth: *Provided,* That the said petition be presented to the said court, at or before the August sessions of the said court, next after the passage of this act.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled, An act to authorize the Governor to incorporate the president, managers and company, of the Lackawaxen turnpike road, passed the seventeenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Lackawaxen turnpike road, commencing on

or near the town plot of the village of Bellmont, in the county of Wayne, shall, instead of terminating at the basin at the head of the Delaware and Hudson canal, terminate at some convenient point at or near the house of Benjamin Jenkins, in Dyberry township, in said county.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That whenever five miles in a continuous line of the said road shall be finished, the president, managers and company, shall give notice thereof to the Governor, who shall thereon forthwith nominate and appoint three skilful and judicious persons, to examine the same, and report to him whether the road is so far executed in a complete and workmanlike manner, according to the true intent and meaning of the act to which this is a supplement; and if their report shall be in the affirmative, then the Governor shall, by license, under his hand and the seal of the commonwealth, permit and suffer the said president, managers and company, to erect and fix such and so many gates upon and across the said road, as will be necessary and sufficient to collect the tolls and duties granted to the said company by the act to which this is a supplement.

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the number of managers of the said company shall hereafter be five, and no more, to be chosen in the manner prescribed by the act to which this is supplementary,

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the act to which this is supplementary as is hereby altered, is hereby repealed.
