

Fishing within certain distances from the sluices of the dams prohibited.

or persons to cast, draw or use, or to direct, permit or aid the casting, drawing or using, any seine, net or other device for taking fish, in any sluices left open or constructed, or that hereafter may be left open or constructed for the passage of rafts and other river craft, in the dam erected in the river Susquehanna, at Duncan's island, and at the Shamokin ripples, at Muncy and at Nanticoke, nor within fifty rods above and below said sluices, nor within fifty perches of either side of the sluices of the dams at Duncan's island, Shamokin and Nanticoke, nor within thirty perches of the sluice of the Muncy dam, but that said sluices shall be and remain open and free, from obstruction, so that fish may pass through the same.

Penalty of \$100.

Recovery and appropriation.

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That every offender against any of the provisions of this act, and every owner of any seine, net, or other device for taking fish, who shall knowingly and wilfully permit the same to be used in taking fish, contrary to the aforesaid provisions, shall forfeit and pay the sum of one hundred dollars for every such offence, to be sued for and recovered in the same manner and for the like uses as penalties incurred under the act to which this is a supplement and the several supplements thereto, are now by law recoverable.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Moyamensing bank in the county of Philadelphia.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That James McCann, Michael Freytag, John Prentis, Thomas Barnett, James Eneu, junior, Alexander W.

Read, Jacob Baker, junior, Thomas D. Grover, William G. Alexander, John Keefe, John Bell, George M. Hickling, William King, William C. Brewster, Henry Leech, junior, Frederick G. Wolbert, James McClure, James Fearon, Robert A. Patton, Robinson R. Moore, Trueman M. Hubbell, Joseph Solms, Robert Pullen, George Kirkpatrick, Frederick A. Raybold, George L. Ashmead, Colonel John Thompson, Andrew Hooten, John Oakford, Thomas Hubble, Samuel H. Trainer, William Harvey, Hugh Catherwood, Isaac Shubert, John Lentz, Thomas Guirey, Daniel Lafferty, George Westenberger, James Ronaldson, Sheldon Potter, James Maxwell, and Michael W. Ash be and they are hereby appointed commissioners who, or a majority of whom, are authorized and empowered to carry into effect, from and after the passage of this act, the establishment of a bank, to be called and known by the name of the Moyamensing bank, in the county of Philadelphia, agreeably to an act passed the twenty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, entitled "an act regulating banks," and an act passed the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, entitled an act to re-charter certain banks, with all and singular the rights and privileges, and subject to all the like restrictions, penalties and taxes imposed upon the said banks by the acts referred to; the bank to be located within the township of Moyamensing, in the county of Philadelphia, with a capital stock not exceeding two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, to be divided into shares of fifty dollars each, and to be managed and directed by thirteen directors, who shall be citizens of this commonwealth, and residents of the city or county of Philadelphia, not more than five of whom shall reside in the city of Philadelphia during the time of their directorship: *Provided*, That no person, either in his own name, or as agent of another, or through the agency of any one, shall take more than five shares the first day, ten shares the second day, and fifty shares the third day; but if the whole stock shall not be subscribed for, on or before the third day, then any number of shares not exceeding the remaining stock unsubscribed for, may be taken; and in case of a violation of the foregoing provision, and complaint thereof made to the Governor of this commonwealth, the Governor shall forthwith inquire into the truth of said complaint, and if he find the same duly supported, it shall be his duty to withhold the charter of incorporation; and for the purpose of giving complainants an opportunity of being heard, the said charter shall not be granted until twenty days after the stock shall have been subscribed: *And provided further*, That the said bank shall pay into the treasury of this commonwealth the sum of twelve thousand five hundred dollars, in three equal annual instalments, as a consideration for

SECT. 2. *And be it further enacted by the authority afore-
said, That it may be lawful for the stockholders to meet at
any time previous to the third Monday in November, one
thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, and to choose, by
ballot, thirteen directors, to serve until the third Monday
in November next, or until others are elected, notice of the
election having first been given at least ten days previous
thereto, in three of the daily newspapers of the city of Phi-
ladelphia, and that this charter shall continue in full force
and effect until the first day of September, one thousand
eight hundred and forty-seven, and no longer.*

SECT. 3. *And be it further enacted by the authority afore-
said, That the eleventh, twelfth and thirteenth sections of
the act to re-charter certain banks, passed the twenty-fifth
day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four,
and also the fifth section of the act entitled An act to es-
tablish a bank in the county of Lebanon, and for other pur-
poses, be, and the same are hereby extended to the bank
chartered by this act.*

Of the eligi-
bility of direct-
ors.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority afore-
said, That so much of the second article of the third section
of the act entitled An act to re charter certain banks, pas-
sed on the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight
hundred and twenty-four, as provides that no person shall
be eligible as a director for more than three years out of
four, and not more than three-fourths of the directors shall
be eligible to be re-elected for the succeeding year, be, and
the same is hereby repealed, as far as regards this act.*

Time of meet-
ing of com-
missioners.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority afore-
said, That the commissioners named in the first section of
this act, or a majority of them, shall meet on the second
Monday in June next, to perform the duties required of them
by this act.*
