

Certain provision in the act of 1824 dispensed with in regard to this bank.

SECT. 4. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That so much of the second article of the third section of the act entitled "An act to re-charter certain banks," passed on the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-four, as provides that no person shall be eligible as a director for more than three years out of four, and not more than three-fourths of the directors shall be eligible to be re-elected for the succeeding year, be, and the same is hereby repealed, as far as regards this act.

Bonus to the state.

SECT. 5. *And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid,* That the said bank shall pay into the treasury of this commonwealth, within one year from the date of the charter of said bank, the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, within two years, twenty-five thousand dollars, and within three years, twenty-five thousand dollars, as a consideration for the said charter.

AN ACT

To annul the marriage contract of Henry Stille and Mary Ann his wife.

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the marriage contract entered into between Henry Stille and Mary Ann his wife, now or late of the city of Philadelphia, be and the same is hereby annulled and made void, and the parties released, set free and discharged from the said marriage contract, and from all duties and obligations arising and derived thereby and therefrom as fully, ef-

fectually and absolutely as if they had never been joined in the bonds of matrimony.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled “An act to enable the mayor, aldermen and citizens of Philadelphia to carry into effect certain improvements and to execute certain trusts.”

SECT. 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the select and common council of the city of Philadelphia, shall be and they are hereby authorized to provide by ordinance or otherwise, for the election or appointment of such officers and agents as they may deem essential to the due execution of the duties and trusts enjoined and created by the will of the late Stephen Girard.
